What's your life like:

1. What's something you spent money on recently that was totally worth it?
2. What's something you did recently that was definitely not worth it?

What are we talking about this week:

Main Point of Message

- This week in Worth It, we're counting the cost of following Jesus and asking an honest question: Is sharing your faith worth it? Talking about Jesus can feel awkward, uncomfortable, or even scary. But Jesus has given every believer the assignment to help others hear the Good News about Jesus. Tonight we're discovering why sharing our faith is always worth it.

Bible Verses

- Romans 10:13-15, Acts 8:26-31, 34-35

Discussion Questions

1. Does sharing your faith ever feel awkward or scary sometimes? If so, what could help?
2. In Romans 10, Paul says people need someone to tell them about Jesus. Why do you think God chooses to use ordinary people like us?
3. The first point was "**God will guide you.**" Have you ever felt God prompting you to share Jesus with someone, or invite someone to church? If you haven't, what do you think that could look like? How do we become more open to those opportunities?
4. The second point was "**You have what they need.**" What do think people your age need most right now that Jesus offers? How can we share that with others?
5. The third point was "**You never know what God will do**" Have you ever been impacted because someone invited you to church, youth group, camp, or something important? What should we do if they say no, don't listen, or it doesn't feel worth it when we share our faith?
6. What's one simple way you as middle school students can share their faith this week at school, on a team, online, or with friends?

Now what:

This week, ask God: "Who is my one?" Think of one friend, teammate, classmate, neighbor, or family member who needs Jesus. Then:

- Pray for them every day this week.
- Listen for God's prompting.
- Invite them to Summerfest!
- Look for a chance to share what Jesus has done in your life.
- Trust that God is working even if you don't see immediate results.
