Here's how we do it:

Praying for the ministry areas, volunteers, and all who will enter the doors

- Check-in with your team lead at your scheduled time to participate in huddle, receive instructions, and pray for one another and those coming to the campus.
- Be committed to your serving time. With the impact of your role in mind, communicate any changes with your team lead.
- Walk through the campus, praying for those entering the doors, taking in the message, and coming forward after service.

Welcoming, listening intently to, and praying for the needs of those seeking prayer

- Be available for volunteer prayer with teams and/or individuals.
- Approach or welcome those coming forward after service with a comforting greeting and smile.
- Be ready and available in front of the auditorium immediately following the service.
- Be available to support resource tables if assigned and lead guests in prayer with the decision to follow Jesus.

Directing those in need to additional care support

- Be familiar with the Prayer Team Volunteer Starter Guide.
- Be familiar with the contents and location of prayer supply boxes in the auditorium.
- Be familiar with One-on-One Care, care groups, and counseling referrals, and how to connect guests with those services.

Amazing Ways to Exceed People's Expectations

- Silently ask the Holy Spirit to help you know how to best care for the person for whom you're praying.
- Go with the person to the next connection point (e.g., Next Steps, bookstore, a pastor), if applicable.
- Let the person know you'll also pray for them throughout the week.
