When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each.

Amazed and astonished, they asked, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia,

Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, "Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power." The Pentecost by Cornelius Cort 1530-1578



The example in the narthex is most likely from a 1602 edition.

Brief description:

Pentecost (Acts 2:1-4); above the Holy Spirit in the form of a dove appears through a gap in clouds surrounded by angels. Beneath in a room the Virgin and the apostles look up in awe.

Background: This engraving was made after an altar painting by Georgio Vasari. Cosimo de' Medici ordered the extensive renovation of the two principal monastic churches in Florence: Santa Maria Novella and Santa Croce. Vasari's Pentecost (1568) was the first altarpiece in the latter project. Cornelius Cort, himself briefly active at Cosimo's court in 1569-70, later engraved the composition in Rome.


