



# What the Progressive Pride Flag Means

The Progressive Pride Flag is more than a burst of color—it's a layered story of history, inclusion, and the ongoing fight for equality.

#### The Rainbow Foundation

Inspired by Gilbert Baker's 1978 design, the six horizontal stripes each stand for a core value:

- **Red** Life
- Orange Healing
- Yellow Sunlight
- **Green** Nature
- Blue Serenity
- Violet Spirit

# **The Chevron for Progress**

Added by Daniel Quasar in 2018, the forward-pointing chevron urges continued progress:

- **Black & Brown** LGBTQ+ people of color, honoring struggles, contributions, and those lost to or living with HIV/AIDS.
- **Light Blue, Pink & White** Trans men, trans women, and non-binary or gender-nonconforming people.

# A Banner of Unity

The rainbow honors the past; the chevron calls for forward motion and ensures no one is left behind—making the flag a powerful emblem of pride and progress.

# Myers Park Baptist Church Statement on LGBTQ+ Inclusion

Myers Park Baptist Church has long stood for inclusivity in our faith community. We originally affirmed this statement almost twenty-four years ago while revising it almost three years ago to make it even more inclusive.

We categorically reject any and all attempts to view or treat our LGBTQ+ sisters and brothers as any less valued than any other human. We continue to stand by and seek to live out this statement of inclusion in our individual lives, in our community of faith, and in our world.

At this point in our life together, we seek a fuller statement of our inclusiveness. We are a Church that believes in the worth of every person as the good creation of God, and we are a Church committed to justice and peace in the civic realm. As such, we want to state our full welcome to and affirmation of all who wish to join us on our journey of faith as outlined in our Covenant. "Open to all and closed to none" means we welcome and affirm all persons without regard to race, gender identity, gender expression, sexual orientation or attraction, biological sex, age, economic status, physical or mental capacity. We believe that God's call, gifts, and blessings are given to all God's people, and we embrace the Spirit of God that calls, gifts, and blesses.
