  (vv. 10-14)
- e. Not be \_\_\_\_\_\_ with silence, waiting, or unanswered prayer.(vv. 15-16)
- f. Find \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ in the truth that God is not after what we are after, and that His timeline is not our timeline. (vv. 17-18)
