With the fall of the Western Roman Empire in 476, a debate began over which pope held authority over the whole church – the one in Rome or the one in Constantinople. Absent a powerful patron, the Western church largely deferred to the Eastern church in religious matters, since the patriarch of the East enjoyed the support of the powerful Byzantine (Eastern Roman) Empire. However, with the rise of the Frankish Kingdom in the West and the erosion of Byzantine power in the East, the pope in Rome increasingly asserted his authority. While these two major branches of Christianity had been growing apart for some time, the crisis accelerated in the 11<sup>th</sup> century over the inclusion of the "Filioque" clause in the Nicene Creed. In 1053, the Patriarch of Constantinople, Michael Cerularius, attacked many practices common to western Christianity. His words came to the attention of Pope Leo IX, who sent a delegation under Cardinal Humbert to reassert Roman authority, something Cerularius refused to accept. Tensions would build as the two factions dug in their heels. Leo died early the following year, which would have nullified the legate's authority; however, the news was slow to arrive in Constantinople (or was perhaps ignored). Humbert entered the Hagia Sophia on July 16, placing a bull of excommunication on the altar. The act was interpreted to mean that the entire church in the East had been excommunicated. Parishioners rioted, burned the bull, and Cerularius responded by excommunicating the Roman delegation. This is known as the Mutual Excommunication of 1054 – the date traditionally given for the official break between Roman Catholicism and Eastern Orthodoxy.

In spite of the schism, relations between East and West remained cordial. The sacking of Constantinople by French and Venetian crusaders in 1204, greatly diminished hopes for reconciliation. Communion between the two churches was briefly reestablished at the Council of Florence in 1439, albeit symbolically. Any further efforts all but ended with the conquest of Constantinople by the Turks in 1453. (Ironically, the mass exodus of religious scholars from the East to the West would sow the seeds of the Protestant Reformation.)

The Eastern Orthodox Church is the second largest Christian denomination in the world with 300 million adherents. The term "Orthodox" derives from the Greek words *orthos* ("true" or "right") and *doxa* ("belief"). There are seventeen "autocephalous" (administratively independent) churches in the Orthodox Communion, although there is no consensus among members over which churches are actually autonomous. Each church is led by a patriarch, who oversees the church within particular geographic bounds. Nearly half of Eastern Orthodox Christians fall under the authority of the Russian Orthodox Church (an issue hotly contested by those in Ukraine and the Baltic States). Meanwhile, conversations over reconciliation between East and West continue to this day.





Children's Hope Alliance is the chosen name of the 2014 merger of Barium Springs and Grandfather Home for Children. The founding organization of CHA began in Charlotte, NC in 1883 supported by the Presbyterian Synod and functioned primarily as orphanages. Prior to the pandemic, CHA was a place of refuge for children suffering from abuse and neglect, and requiring treatment and therapy.

The world is changing and children's needs are changing along with it. The focus moving forward has shifted to helping children within their family unit (whether biological or foster) rather than in group homes (which is much more costly). In 2022, CHA served over 2,500 children and families in 62 NC counties. A family unit is the very definition of home – not a building, campus, or institution. CHA's community-based service array is innovative and successful and growing. Their comprehensive programs give hope to North Carolina's children and families by providing a safe family home, a pathway to healing, and a healthy start toward a bright future.
