Every few months or so, new offering envelopes will mysteriously appear in our Sunday bulletin. Not everyone is quite sure what these offerings are for, or what causes they support (and I confess that I don't always do a great job explaining it). Those envelopes are part of the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Special Offerings that help to fund a variety of outreach and mission activities through our denomination. There are four special offerings throughout the year.

Typically received during Lent, the **One Great Hour of Sharing** offering mainly supports three programs: Presbyterian Disaster Assistance, a relief organization that responds to the needs of communities affected by natural or man-made disasters; the Presbyterian Hunger Program that supplies nutritional support for food-insecure households; and the Self-Development of People, that provides resources and advocacy for underserved communities.

Received the Day of Pentecost, the **Pentecost Offering** supports initiatives aimed at children, youth, and young adults. It helps to finance the PC(USA) Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) program that sends recent college graduates into mission fields around the globe, as well as the Presbyterian Youth Triennium – the largest gathering of Presbyterian youth held every three years. The offering also engages in outreach toward at-risk children and families, including the "Educate a Child, Transform the World" initiative that advocates for quality public education.

Collected in the fall, the **Peace & Global Witness Offering** funds a variety of initiatives that are aimed toward finding peaceful resolutions to conflicts stemming from systematic injustice, both locally, and around the world. Local congregations retain 25% of the offering to support peace advocates at home; another 25% supports such efforts regionally, and the remaining 50% helps to support global peace initiatives through the Presbyterian Mission Agency.

Last, but not least, is the **Christmas Joy Offering** (the next to be collected). Received during the season of Advent, this offering provides financial support to church workers and families facing economic hardship through the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions. Through a variety of grants and scholarships, it also helps to fund scholarships and grants for minority students who attend Presbyterian Church (USA) affiliated colleges and universities.

I hope this clears a few things up. Of course, for a far more detailed explanation, I encourage you to visit the PC(USA) Special Offerings website to learn more about how your contributions are making a difference in people's lives both at home and around the world. What is the purpose of the Columbarium?

The Columbarium consists of niches, uniform in size of the capacity to hold the cremated remains of 1 or 2 people. Each niche is covered with a granite plate, uniform in size, with a cast bronze name plaque with the name (s) and dates of birth and death of the deceased. Cremation after death is an increasingly popular choice considering lack of land for cemeteries and sustainable land use. Looking to make a difference in our local community and in communities worldwide, a total of 66 Shallotte/South Brunswick CROP Hunger Walkers raised over \$15,000 to help end hunger and poverty through long-term sustainable approaches to significantly reduce or eliminate hunger. A

portion of the funds raised here in Brunswick County will come back to The Lord's Food Pantry, a mission of the South Brunswick Interchurch Council (SBIC).

This year Shallotte/South Brunswick County and some 1,000 other communities nationwide are joining together in interfaith CROP Hunger Walks around the theme "Ending hunger one step at a time." Many of the Walkers wore new t-shirts proclaiming their solidarity with the millions of neighbors around the world who have to walk to live -- as well as with the millions served by local food pantries, food banks and meal sites here in the U.S. These local ministries share in the funds raised by CROP Hunger Walks.

From combating droughts in Nicaragua to providing agricultural training in Indonesia to stocking shelves in hundreds of food pantries across the United States, CROP Hunger Walks are Fighting Hunger One Step At A Time. Thank you for your support of the CROP Hunger Walk again this year.
