CONFESSION & ABSOLUTION

- P: Since then we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.
- C: For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin.

P: Let us then with confidence draw near to the throne of grace, that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Moment of Silent Confession

- P: Jesus, our Great High Priest,
- C: We humbly confess to You that we are weak. In our weakness, we sin against You and one another with our words and actions, and in our thoughts and the lack thereof. Our sins cut us off from You.
