# OPENING HYMN "Christ is Risen, Christ is Living"

### OPENING LITURGY

P: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen.

P: Alleluia! Christ is risen!

C: He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

P: Worthy is the Lamb who was slain,

C: To receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!

P: To Him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb

C: Be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!

P: As we gather together in the new life Christ has won for us, we confess our sins to God and ask His forgiveness. We do this regularly so that we might hear again the Good News of our Lord Jesus Christ. Paul writes, "Just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might walk in newness of life."

## Moment of Silent Confession

- P: Let us confess our sins before God our Father, and Christ, our risen King!
- C: Resurrected Lord and Savior, we come before You and acknowledge the darkness that still maintains a foothold in our lives and is evidenced in our thoughts, words, and actions. Our lives do not always bear witness to the victorious power of Your resurrection. Forgive us, renew us, and lead us by the power of Your Spirit, so that we may walk in Your ways and reveal Your resurrection love to the world.

- P: Your merciful God is the author and giver of life! He hears your prayers and forgives you all your sins. Through Jesus, He takes your death upon Himself at the cross and, by His resurrection, gives you the free gift of life everlasting. As your pastor, it is my privilege to remind you of this forgiving grace of Jesus and, because He has granted His authority to do so, I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

# RESPONSE "Alleluia! Christ is Risen!"

### A MOTHER'S DAY LITANY

- P: You have searched me, Lord, and you know me. You know when I sit and when I rise; you perceive my thoughts from afar.
- C: You discern my going out and my lying down; you are familiar with all my ways.
- P: Before a word is on my tongue you, Lord, know it completely.
- C: You hem me in behind and before, and you lay your hand upon me.
- P: Such knowledge is too wonderful for me, too lofty for me to attain.
- C: For you created my inmost being; you knit me together in my mother's womb.
- P: I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well.
- C: My frame was not hidden from you when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth.

- P: Your eyes saw my unformed body; all the days ordained for me were written in your book before one of them came to be.
- C: How precious to me are your thoughts, God! How vast is the sum of them! Were I to count them, they would outnumber the grains of sand—when I awake, I am still with you.
- P: Lord, on this day set aside to honor and remember mothers, we give you thanks for our mothers. We are grateful that you chose to give us life through them, and that they received the gift of life from your hands and gave it to us. Thank you for the sacrifices they made in carrying us and giving us birth. We thank you for the women who raised us; who held us and fed us, who cared for us and kissed away our pain. We pray that our lives may reflect the love they showed us, and that they would be pleased to be called our moms.
- P: We pray for older moms whose children are grown.
- C: Grant them joy and satisfaction for a job well done.
- P: We pray for new moms experiencing changes they could not predict.
- C: Grant them rest and peace as they trust you for the future.
- P: We pray for pregnant women who will soon be moms.
- C: Grant them patience and good counsel in the coming months.
- P: We pray for moms who face the demands of single parenthood.
- C: Grant them strength and wisdom.
- P: We pray for moms who are raising their children in poverty.
- C: Grant them relief and justice.
- P: We pray for step-mothers.
- C: Grant them patience and understanding and love.
- P: We pray for moms who are separated from their children.
- C: Grant them faith and hope.
- P: We pray for moms in marriages that are in crisis.
- C: Grant them support and insight.
- P: We pray for moms who have lost children.
- C: Grant them comfort in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

- P: We pray for moms who gave up their children for adoption.
- C: Grant them peace and confidence as they trust in your providence.
- P: We pray for adoptive mothers.
- C: Grant them joy and gratitude for the gift you have provided.
- P: We pray for women who desperately want, or wanted, to be moms.
- C: Grant them grace to accept your timing and will.
- P: We pray for all women who have assumed the mother's role in a child's life.
- C: Grant them joy and the appreciation of others.
- P: We pray for those who are grieving the loss of their mother in the past year.
- C: Grant them comfort and hope in Christ's resurrection.
- P: Lord, we thank you for the gift of motherhood in our lives. And we thank you for Mary the mother of our Lord Jesus Christ, who had the courage in faith to say "yes" to your calling. Bless the mothers among us on this special day; through Christ Jesus, our Lord.

For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. And his mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts; he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate; he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his offspring forever."
