Home Group Notes Week of October 26, 2025 Ephesians 5:1-20



WHO IS LIKE GOD?

I once heard a kid say that their dad was like God. Wow! If that kid knows God, that was a huge compliment. So, who do you know is like God in some way? What are the ways?

LET'S LEARN TOGETHER

The Scriptures are God's words that are written under God's supervision (The Holy Spirit) and preserved so that we might know God and live with Him forever. For this week, we will be reading and learning from Ephesians chapter five. In the first three chapters, we see that God has blessed us, has united us into one family, and now calls us to live "worthy" of His calling.

Read Ephesians 5:1-20 and ask God to help you learn from His words.

The context of these commands is found in the previous chapter. What is said in each of the following verses:

- 4:1
- 4:17
- 4:32

Chapter five has a series of commands that are <u>based on our calling and our new identity</u>. Read through 5:1-20 and list below the descriptions of our identity.

Our lives "in Christ" should lead us to trust and obey God in our behavior. Read back through and list the commands for how we are to live as followers of Jesus.

This is quite a list. Which of these commands encourage you to ask God to help you obey them?

The first command is overarching: "Be imitators of God." How is this even possible or probable? What has God provided to help us begin to live like Jesus?

DISCUSS TOGETHER

The idea of imitating God sounds beyond daunting to impossible. And yet, this is the first command of this chapter. What do you think God has in mind by including this command?

How does knowing our calling and identity help us live out these commands?

One commentator listed four incentives to holiness in our lives. Which of these incentives challenge and motivate you to live like Jesus?

- 1) A certainty of judgment
- 2) The fruit of light
- 3) The nature of wisdom
- 4) The fullness of the Holy Spirit
