The Situation for Jewish captives in Babylon

What is wrong with us? Why is our history full of wars? What is the root of this? What will change this?

THE KING'S DECLARATION

When we turn to God, we want <u>everyone</u> to know!

The king seems to have taken the first steps toward salvation: <u>Repent</u> and <u>recognize</u> that God is God and we are not. (See Romans 1:21)

King Nebuchadnezzar recognized the power and majesty of God, the true King: His kingdom is <u>eternal</u>, His dominion <u>endures</u> forever

THE KING'S DREAM

The massive tree represents THE GREATNESS of the king and kingdom.

The stump represents THE UESLESSNESS of the king without God's enablement.

When people assume God's place, they become <u>BEASTS</u>. (We were never meant to rule over people. See also "Daniel" 7-8)

To live in God's favor begins with **HUMILITY**.

THE KING'S HUMILIATION

The roof of your palace is a <u>DANGEROUS</u> place.

Everything you are and have is a GIFT from God. (James 1:17)

THE KING'S RESTORATION

The <u>FEAR</u> of God is the beginning of wisdom. (Proverbs 9:10)

The discipline of God is an act of <u>BLESSING</u>. For the Jews in exile, this brought <u>HOPE</u>.

THE PROBLEM OF PRIDE

Sin has its roots in pride.

We are all KINGS in our own world.

The <u>TWO SIDES</u> of pride: Putting myself in the center of my attention: 'I am better' and 'I am lesser'. Both require comparison.

EXPRESSIONS OF PRIDE

Desire to rule, controlling others, lacking gratitude, doubting God's goodness

APPLICATION: HOW TO AVOID THE PRIDE THAT LEADS TO SIN?

KNOW: God is sovereign, the one and only true King and Lord

FEEL: I am a child of God. I don't need to be God in my or others lives.

DO: Live a life of thanksgiving, praise, and trusting God

HOW:

- 1) Saturate yourself in God's character in His Word
- 2) Follow Jesus TOGETHER. ("Kings don't have relationships" R. Buffam)
- 3) Give up self-focus and comparison
- 4) Allow access to godly people
- 5) BE HUMBLE LIKE JESUS (Philippians 2:8)
