Qualities of Nehemiah's Prayer

- He knew who God was, 1:4-5 "God of heaven, great and awesome God, Covenant keeper, provider of steadfast love"
- He invited God's attention, 1:6a "Let your ear be attentive and your eyes open"
- He recognized and confessed the sins of others and his own sins, 1:6-7 "Confessing the sins of the people of Israel, which we have sinned against you!"
- He claimed God's past promises of blessing, 1:8-9 "Remember the word you commanded..."
- He depended on that past relationship and protection from God as grounds for his present deliverance, 1:10-11 "They are your servants and your people, whom you redeemed by your great power and your strong hand."

Nehemiah's Plan

- He made himself available, 2:11 "So I went to Jerusalem..."
- He joined others in facing the problems, 2:17 "You see the trouble we're in..."
- He offered practical solutions, 2:17 "Come let us build..."
- **He clearly saw and shared God's presence**, 2:18 "And I told them of the hand of my God that had been upon me for good...and also of the words of the king"
- He expected opposition, 2:19 "... They jeered at us and despised us..."
- He trusted in God, 2:20 "The God of heaven will make us prosper..."
