2023 Christmas Offering

This fall, we put our focus on prayer, particularly the power of breakthrough prayer - when we ask God to move through and/or beyond the barriers that hinder the realization of God's dreams for our lives. Our Advent/Christmas sermon series, "We're Expecting," seeks to extend our breakthrough prayer focus.

Sermon Series Summary: As a praying people, we expect God to hear and respond to our prayers. And if we are expecting God to appear, act or speak in this world, how might we engage in the midwifery needed to bring God's will to birth?

With the "We're Expecting" series in mind, the Mission Team of Minnetonka United Methodist Church decided to further the "We're Expecting" theme and earmark our 2023 Christmas Offering for three different organizations that serve mothers, babies and young children in different ways.

Imara International is a home for teenage mothers and their children in Nanyuki, Kenya. There, young mothers are given a chance to finish their education, learn vocational skills, grow in faith and practice life and

parenting skills. Their children are cared for and have access to proper nutrition, early learning and education.

Sojourner, located in Hopkins, provides emergency shelter for women and children, support and legal advocacy services to persons victimized by domestic violence and other forms of interpersonal violence. The organization advocates for victim safety, offers support during the transition from victim to survivor and seeks to educate individuals and the general public about prevention and the elimination of domestic violence.

Inter-congregational Communities Association (ICA) exists to better the larger community by connecting people with the food, employment, mental health services and housing they need.

When the church's Mission Team had a tour of ICA, we learned that baby formula and food, diapers (all sizes) and wipes are nearly always in short supply. This Christmas, in addition to monetary gifts, let's bless our neighbors in need with supplies to care for their little ones (as noted in the graphic below). Supplies can be placed in front of the altar before/after worship or during the Receiving of the Offering.

Thank you for your participation and generosity! Christmas Offering envelopes will be waiting for you in the Sanctuary and lobby.




and production technician. They have two precious kids, Billy and Bella, who will hopefully join the worship team when they get a little older.
