

Hey families! Here's a look at what your kid is learning this month.

MONTHLY MEMORY VERSE

Ephesians 2:10

"For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." (We're only memorizing the first part!)

JULY 6TH

This week, kids see how Elisha helped a widow get out of debt.

BIG IDEA: God asks us to help each other.

BIBLE: 2 Kings 4:1-7

ASK:

- What was the problem the widow needed help with? A creditor wanted to take away her two sons as payment for her late husband's debts.
- Where did the widow get the jars for the oil? The widow's neighbors helped her by giving her their empty jars.
- What did God do with all the empty jars they had collected? Filled them with oil from the widow's small jar, which didn't stop flowing until all the jars were full.
- Do you find it easy or difficult to help others? Why?
- What special skill or talent do you have that could be helpful to someone else?

CHALLENGE: Ask your kid, "what is one way (big or small) that you can help someone else this week?" As a family, come up with a few ways you can help someone else and work together to plan and accomplish those goals this week.



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JULY 13TH

This week, kids see how **Elisha prayed** for God to bring the **Shunammite's son** back to life.

BIG IDEA: God can do impossible things. BIBLE: 2 Kings 4:8–37 ASK:

- What did the Shunammite woman and her husband do for Elisha? They prepared a room for him to stay in whenever he was in town.
- What did Elisha say God would give the woman and her husband? *A baby.*
- What happened to the baby when he grew up? He died.
- What was the Shunammite woman's first response when she learned that her son had died? What does this say about her faith? She turned to Elisha. She did not know what to expect, but she knew that God could do something impossible through Elisha.
- What impossible thing did God do through Elisha? *He brought the boy back to life!*
- Why is it easy to give up on things that seem impossible?
- Can you think of a time when something felt impossible at first but then became possible?

CHALLENGE: Set up an "impossible trick shot" with your kids and spend time trying to make a shot. Need ideas? Watch Dude Perfect or How Ridiculous. Remind your kids that God can do impossible things!



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JULY 20TH

This week, kids see how Elisha took care of others during a famine.

BIG IDEA: God helps us solve big problems.

BIBLE: 2 Kings 4:38-44

ASK:

- Why was it a big challenge for Elisha's servant to gather food for a stew? Because there was a famine in the land.
- What did Elisha do when they realized the stew had "death in the pot"? *He added flour.*
- What happened to the stew when Elisha added flour? It became safe to eat.
- In the second story, why did the servant wonder if giving bread to the people was a good idea? There didn't seem to be enough to feed everyone there.
- How many people did Elisha feed with twenty loaves of bread? One hundred.
- Who do you go to when you have a problem?
- What are some big problems that you need God's help with?
- Can you think of a big problem where you can be a part of the solution? How?

CHALLENGE: This



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JULY 27TH

This week, kids see how Naaman received Elisha's help to be healed of leprosy.

BIG IDEA: God gives us more than we can imagine.

BIBLE: 2 Kings 5:1–14

ASK:

- Who was the man who needed healing for his leprosy? Naaman.
- Naaman's king sent a letter and lots of gifts so that Naaman could meet whom? *Elisha*.
- Why did Naaman want to meet with Elisha? Naaman had leprosy. He wanted Elisha to heal him of this disease.
- What message did Elisha send Naaman? To wash in the river seven times.
- Why was Naaman angry after Elisha told him to wash in the Jordan? Naaman was angry Elisha didn't come and pray for him in person. He probably also felt that simply washing in the Jordan was beneath him.
- What happened when he listened to Elisha? He was healed!
- What are some things you need?
- What are some things others you know need? What can you do for them? What can God do for them?
- What is one way God has given you more than you can imagine?

CHALLENGE: Play a prank on your kid this week – when they ask for something, instead of giving them a small amount, make it HUGE! Share with your kids a moment where God has given you more than you can imagine and tell them how it inspired you to give them more than they could imagine!
