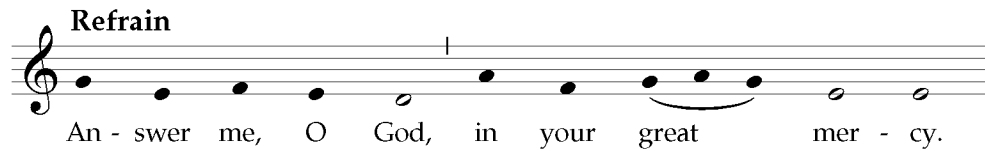

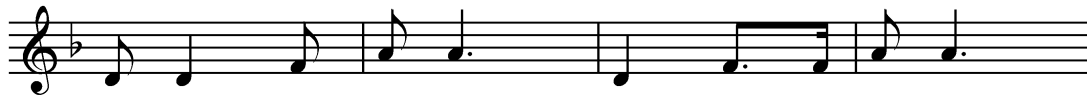

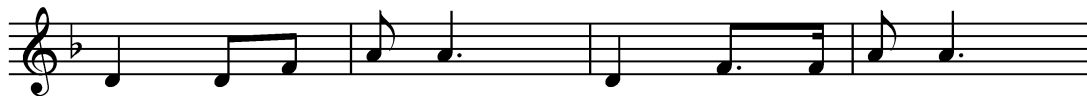

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:





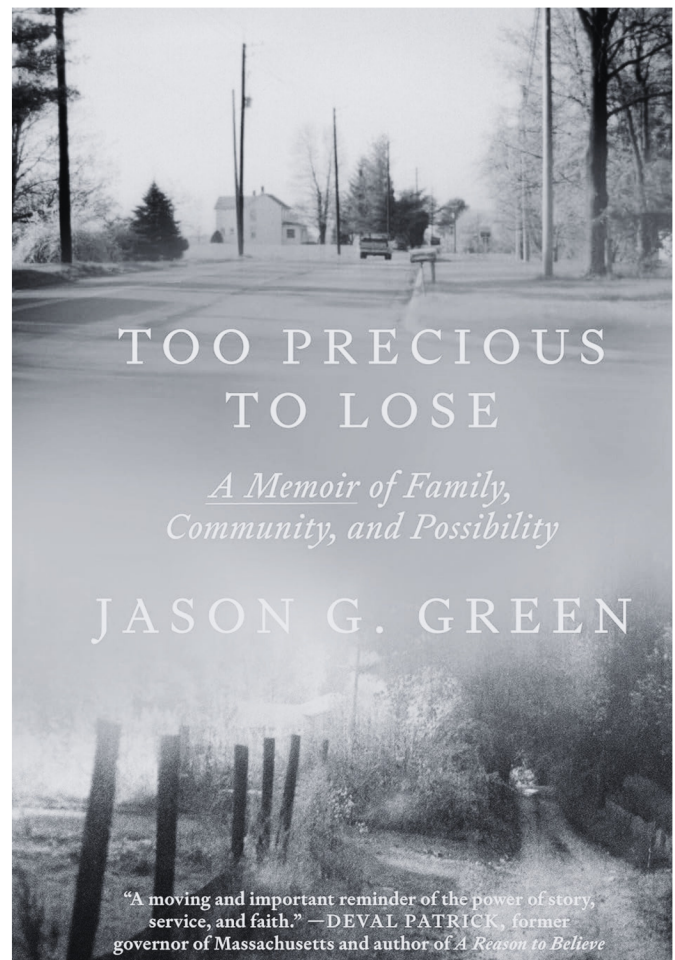

Jason G. Green "Too Precious to Lose"

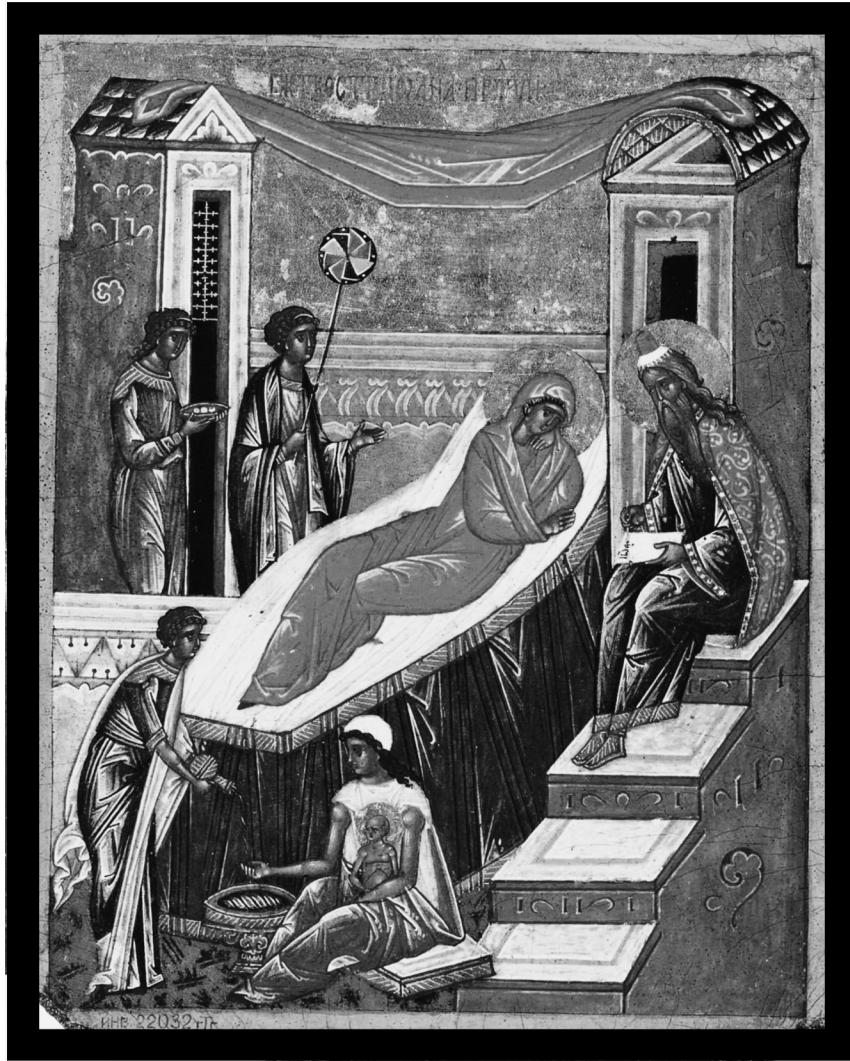


After working on Barack Obama's presidential campaign, Jason G. Green spent four and a half years serving in the White House as special assistant to President Obama.
