

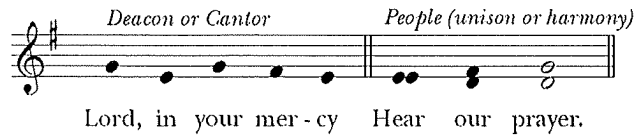

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:





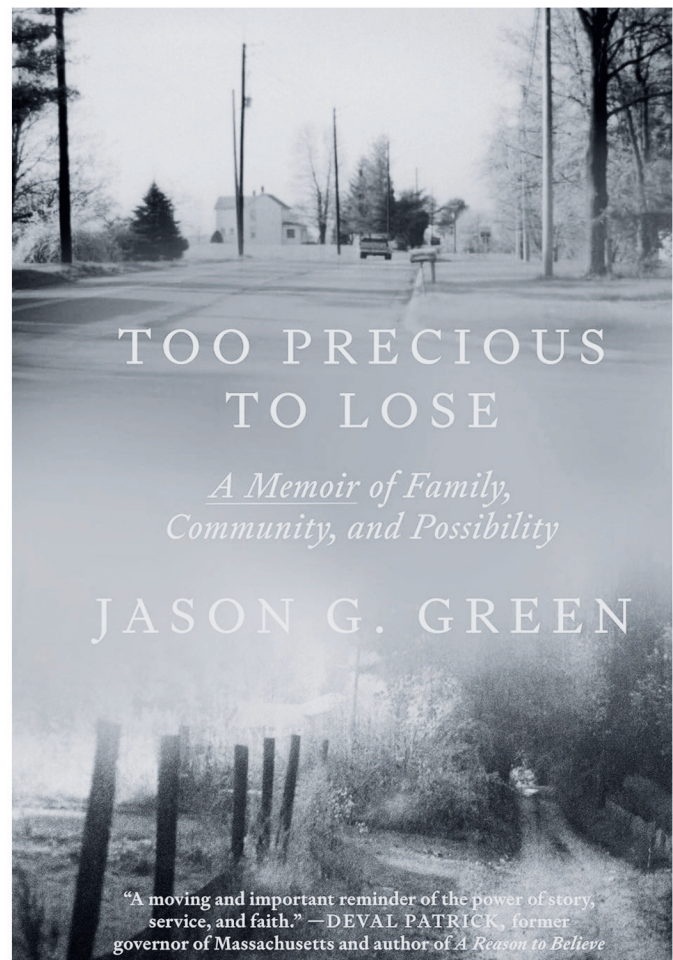

Jason G. Green “Too Precious to Lose”



After working on Barack Obama’s presidential campaign, Jason G. Green spent four and a half years serving in the White House as special assistant to President Obama. However, Green’s government career was cut short by a devastating call. It seemed his beloved ninety-five-year-old grandmother was on her deathbed. At her side, he listened in disbelief while she detailed her life story dating back to her 1918 birth in Quince Orchard, a town that once stood where they now sat, erased by the vestiges of time.

St. David's Small Groups Forming Now

- St. David's is re-launching its small group ministry, which has been dormant since before COVID, and re-vamping the format.
- Small Groups will launch in Fall 2026 and follow an academic, two-semester format.
- Small Groups will meet during the week around the city, in an effort to unite the parish beyond Sundays, across services, and in accessible locations.
- Small Groups will meet 1-2x a month in parishioners' homes, or in local public spots like libraries, coffee shops, or parks.
- Groups will read a book together each semester, meeting to eat, fellowship, and grow in faith together around a common text and a shared prayer life.
