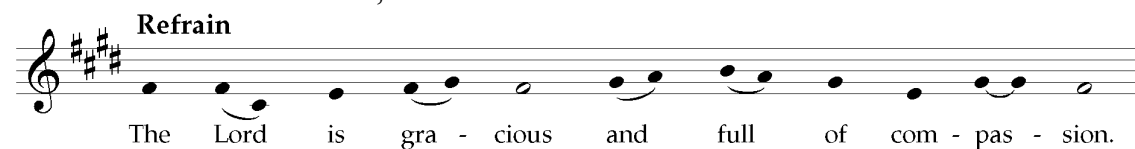

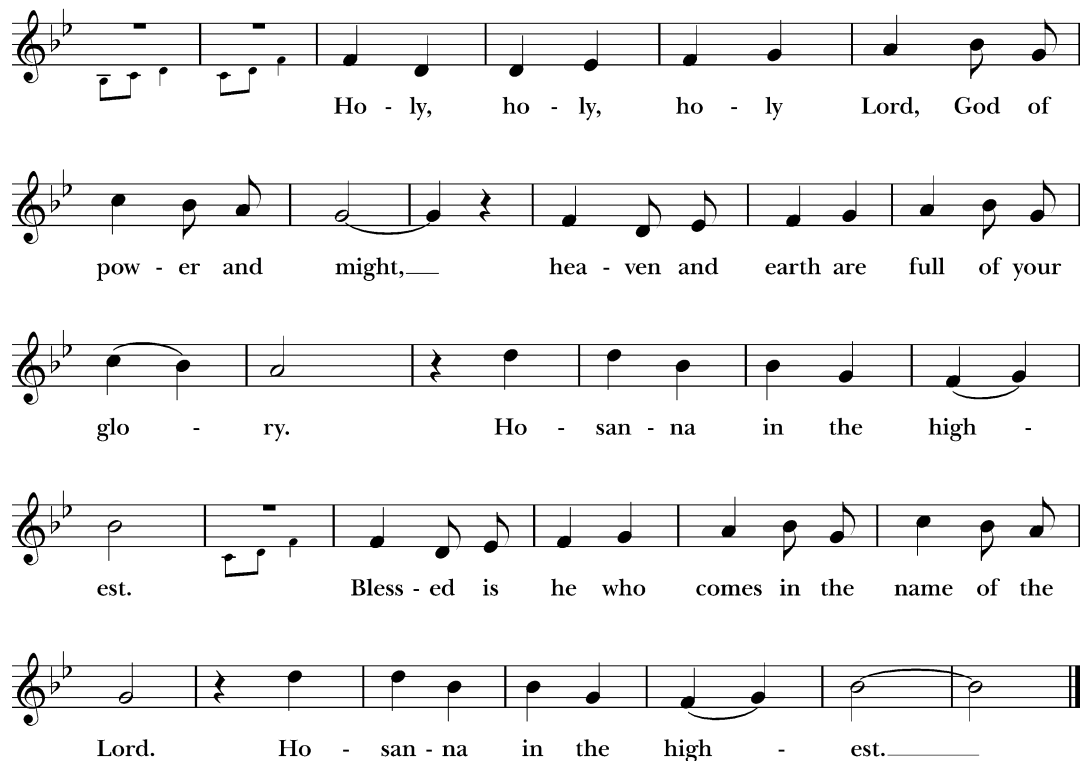

**Christ is risen.**

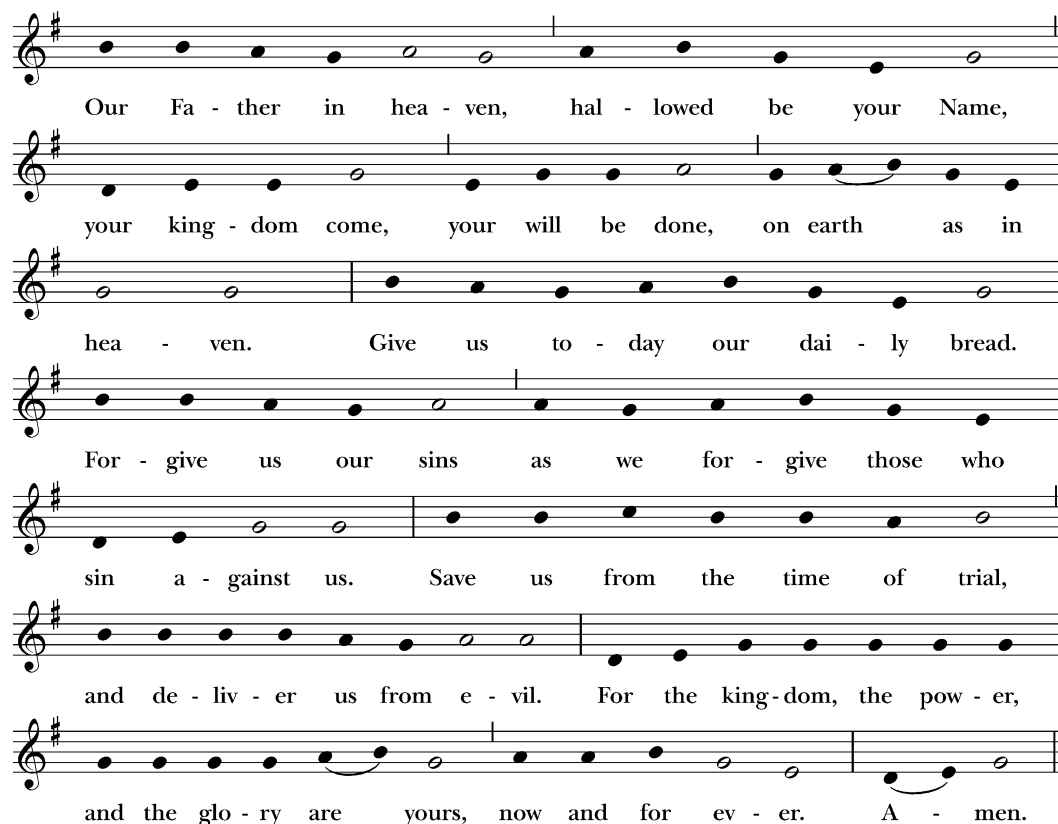
**Christ will come again.**

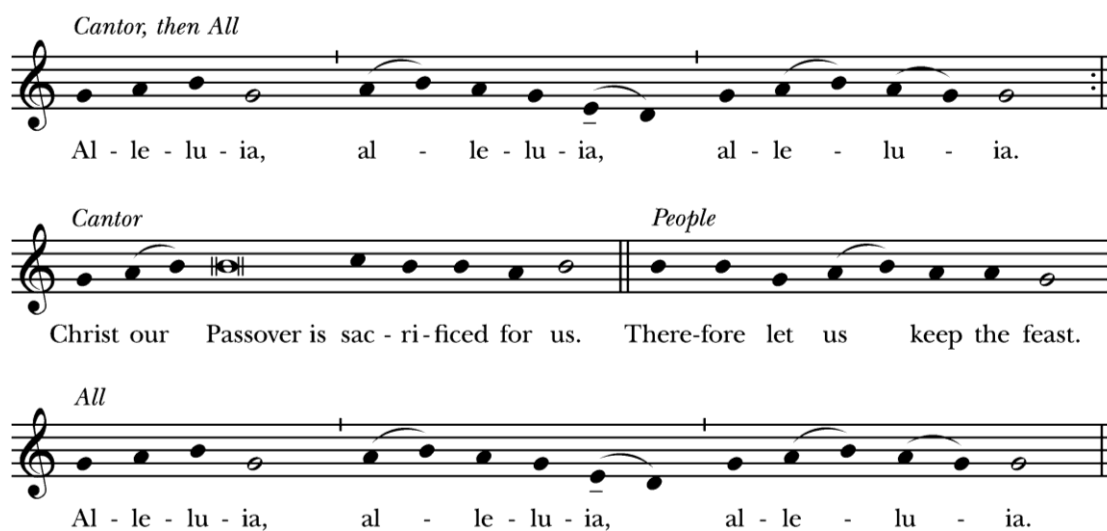
