




Today, after worship, **everyone** is invited to Fellowship Hall for a special celebration honoring those with birthdays this month!



Do We Welcome Jesus?

Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week, a time of deep reflection, humility, and anticipation. It is a day filled with symbolism and profound significance as we remember Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, greeted by the people who laid palm branches at his feet, shouting, "Hosanna!" They hailed him as King, unaware of the deeper, sacrificial journey that lay ahead.

This celebration reminds us of how quickly joy can turn to sorrow, and how unreliable human praise can be. The same crowd that praised Jesus would, days later, call for his crucifixion. As we wave our palm branches, whether physically or in spirit, let us renew our commitment to follow Jesus wholeheartedly. May we allow his humble yet victorious entrance into Jerusalem to inspire us to trust him, even when the road is uncertain, knowing that with him, victory is always assured.

Hosanna in the highest! Let us welcome the King of Kings with faith, hope, and love.
