By placing it at the front, we affirm that children are an important and visible part of our church family.








### GENERAL LITURGY 5 Grace

#### (Standing)

We worship you, Lord God, the high and lofty one, who inhabits eternity, whose name is holy. You dwell in the high and holy place, and also with those who are contrite and humble in spirit.

Give us grace to bring you the sacrifice of a broken and contrite heart, which you, O God, will not despise.



The law of the Lord is perfect, reviving the soul; the decrees of the Lord are sure, making wise the simple.


More to be desired are they than gold, even much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb.

GENERAL 5: GRACE

God spoke these words, saying:

You shall have no other gods besides me. You shall not make for yourself an idol. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God. Remember the sabbath day, and keep it holy. Honor your father and your mother. You shall not murder. You shall not commit adultery. You shall not steal. You shall not steal. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. You shall not covet anything that belongs to your neighbor.

Our Lord Jesus Christ said: I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. If you love me, you will keep my commandments.

In the peace of God, let us join in professing our faith:



In this spirit we await the appearing of Jesus Christ, go forward to meet our Lord with joy, and pray to be found ready when he comes. Amen.





# Suggested Items for Donation to Lititz / Warwick Community Chest




FOOD

DONATIONS

We are okay with normal size products, rather than really large sizes. Our clients often have limited storage space.

Items in **bold** tend to be in low supply most often.

- canned fruit: **pineapple, pears**, peaches, fruit cocktail, etc.
- applesauce
- spaghetti sauce (glass is accepted, but canned / plastic is preferred)
- pasta and noodles (all types)
- canned tomatoes: diced or stewed
- baked beans
- canned beans: kidney, northern, navy, pinto, black, etc.
- helpers: hamburger, chicken, tuna
- instant mashed potatoes
- rice: brown or white
- flavored pasta or rice mixes
- canned chicken or Spam (we received lots of tuna already)
- canned stew or sloppy joe sauce
- mini meals for children: spaghetti-o's, ravioli, etc.
- condiments: mayo, ketchup, mustard
- peanut butter
- jelly or jam
- hot or cold breakfast cereal
- instant oatmeal packets



### **Before It Was a Doctrine**

The World Council of Churches reminds us that 2025 is the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Council of Nicaea. In 325, the Roman emperor Constantine summoned a gathering of 318 bishops, aiming to establish greater stability across his empire. The council's crowning achievement was the formation of the Nicaean Creed, which laid the foundation for our doctrine of the Holy Trinity.

Today we lift up this great teaching stating that the one God is revealed in three distinct ways, as Father, as Son, and as Holy Spirit. When someone joins our church, we ask only one question regarding belief: *Do you believe in God as your Creator and loving Heavenly Father, in Jesus Christ as your Savior and Lord, and in the Holy Spirit as your Comforter and Sustainer?* On the foundation of this belief, children are baptized, youth confirm their faith, hands are joined in marriage, the dead are buried, and we as followers of Jesus Christ live out our faith. But even as we embrace this teaching, a mystery remains. How can three be one and one be three? What kind of math is this?

Long before the Trinity became a doctrine, it was an experience. Centuries before the Council of Nicaea, the Trinity was a lived reality of the earliest followers of Jesus. They knew God as their Heavenly Father and Creator. They encountered God in the unique personality of Jesus the Christ. They were moved by God as a mothering Holy Spirit, nurturing and empowering them into the compassionate, reconciling, and nonviolent way of Jesus.

Before the Trinity was a doctrine, it was an experience. We might not be able to fully understand it, but like those earliest disciples, how good it is nonetheless to enjoy it.
