It is truly right and good to sing to you, to bless you and to praise you, to thank you and to worship you throughout all the universe, for you are God, eternal and glorious, beyond the highest powers of our comprehension, with your onlybegotten Son and your Holy Spirit. Through your Word you brought us forth from nothingness into being, and raised us when we had fallen into sin, leaving nothing undone to bring us to your heavenly kingdom which is to come. For all your love and saving work, for all your goodness and benefits to us, known and unknown, seen and unseen, we thank you, humbly rejoicing that you graciously accept this service from our hands, though you are surrounded by countless thousands of angels and archangels, cherubim and seraphim, who soar aloft on wings of light singing to you their triumphal song:

### Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Together with all the heavenly hosts we join our voices to proclaim your glorious majesty, O Lover of humanity, for you loved the world so much that you sent your only-begotten Son so that all who believe in him might not perish, but have eternal life. # **Clear Instructions**

Travel with humility. Accept hospitality. Shake the dust from your feet when you're rejected. These are the instructions Jesus gives to the apostles as they are sent out to proclaim God's reign. They know they will face opposition along the way. They know they will be called upon to speak the truth of God's love in situations that may threaten their very safety.

Today Moravians reflect upon the witness of Jan Hus, a reformer who took these words of Jesus to heart. He preached against corruption and resisted the authorities of the day to share the Gospel with God's people in ways that were accessible, meaningful, effective, and faithful. He certainly met with opposition, to the point of his martyrdom in 1415.

In Jesus' instructions and Hus's example, we find a formula for sharing the Gospel in times of opposition and challenge. We are sent with authority that comes from God. We go with humility. We accept the support we receive. We shake off the rejection as it occurs. In every circumstance, we act boldly and humbly for the sake of God's love for all of humanity.

Who are the role models for you today of this kind of service? What are the steps you desire to take, in order to be ever more faithful to the Gospel?
