#### **Shared Joys and Concerns and Prayer**

#### Scripture: Romans 8:18-27

I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God, for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will, but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope that the creation itself will be set free from its enslavement to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. # Ways to give in December


This December, there are so many ways to give back and share God's love with others. Even small acts of kindness can make a big difference in someone's day.

Place new socks inside the red bag with Dobby and they will be distributed to a local charity during the holiday season.










# **Christmas Community Chest**

Lititz Moravian children and youth will be meeting on Sunday, December 14 following the 10:30am service to wrap Christmas gifts for two local families.


We have our assigned Christmas families and *know their needs*.
