In Celebration of the Chief Eldership of Jesus Christ

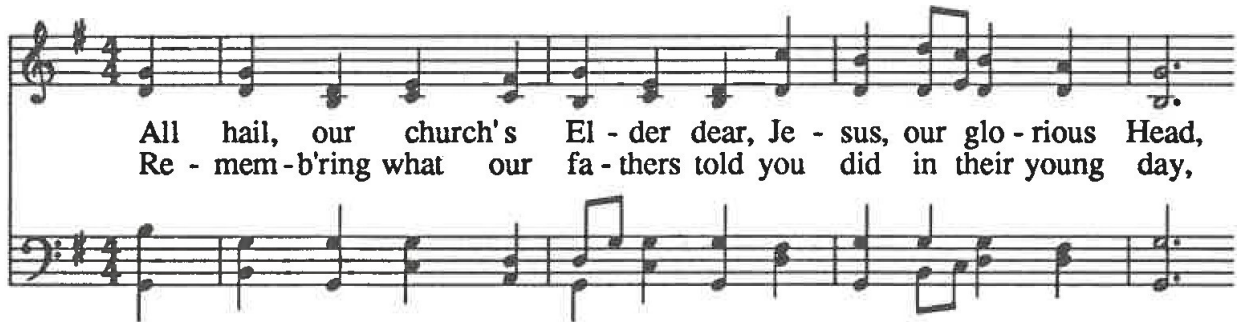

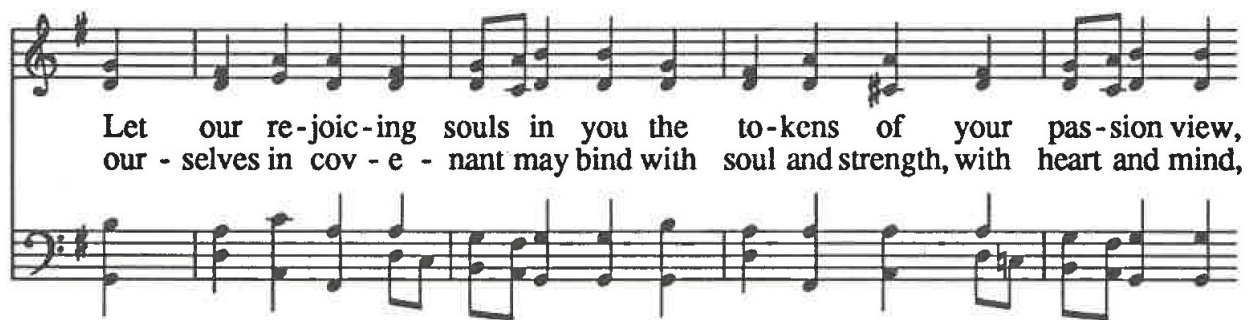

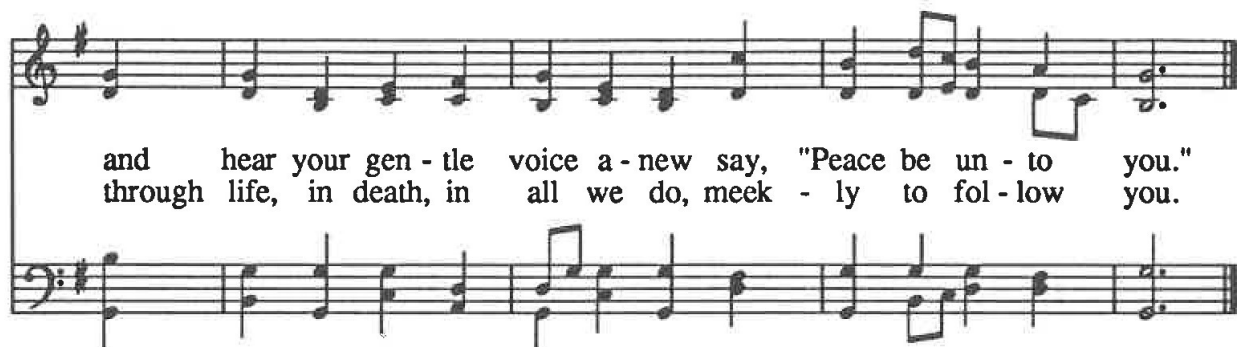

(Sitting. As the bread is served, the communicants stand to receive it.)

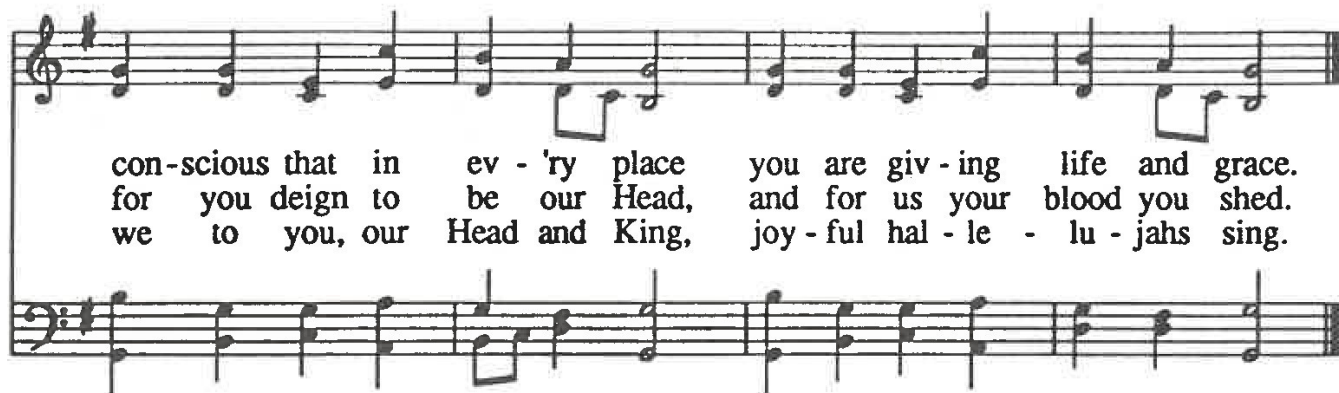
