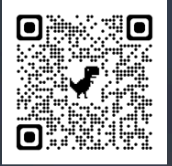

## Blowing Your Nose



How often do we stop to give thanks for the small things—the everyday moments and simple functions that we often take for granted? Today, I'd like to encourage us all to pause and consider the beauty of gratitude for even the most ordinary things—like the ability to blow our noses.

It may seem like an odd example, but have you ever had a cold so bad that your nose was completely blocked? Or, like me, having surgery that impacted your sinus or your nose? In those moments, you suddenly realize how wonderful it is to breathe freely. Something as simple as tissue and the ability to clear our sinuses can become a great blessing in times of discomfort. How quickly do we forget to be grateful for that essential function when we regain health?

This idea of appreciating the small things is woven throughout scripture.

In 1 Thessalonians 5:18, Paul reminds us to “give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” That “all” includes not just the significant milestones of life but the little gifts scattered throughout our days—waking up with energy, enjoying a warm cup of coffee, hearing a child's laughter, or feeling the sun on our skin.

God's goodness is not only found in grand miracles but also in quiet, unnoticed blessings. Jesus modeled this kind of gratitude by giving thanks before breaking bread with his disciples. It was a simple meal yet an opportunity to acknowledge God's provision.

Let's train our hearts to notice the little things. Let's give thanks for clean sheets, a well-timed green light, a friendly smile, or even the ability to blow our noses. When we cultivate gratitude for the small blessings, we see how much God's love and care surrounds us daily.

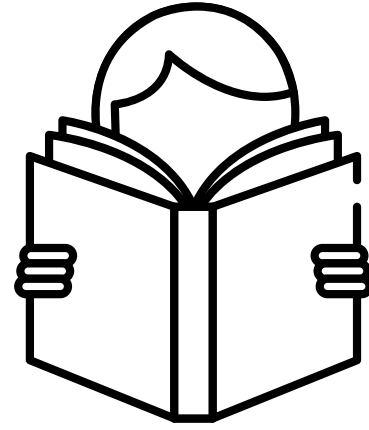
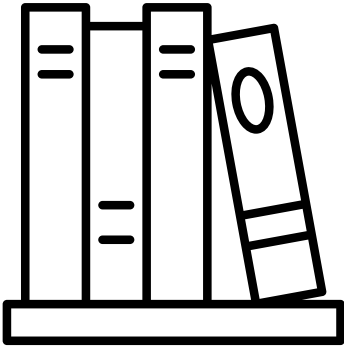


Escorting the famous Peabody ducks in the elevator from their penthouse on the roof to the lobby fountain!

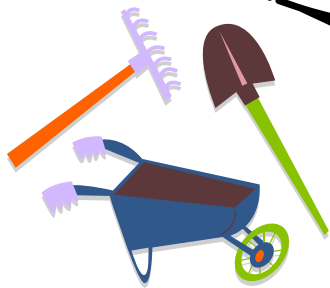
# VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

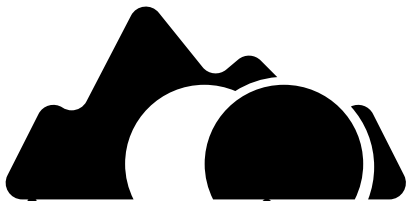
Mulch and final clean-up is scheduled for
