“The Moravian Seal”

The seal of the Moravian Church goes back to the sixteenth century. In the center of the seal is a lamb of the early Christian Church; and has been adopted as the Triumphant Lamb of the Moravian Church. Behind the lamb is a staff with the banner of victory displaying the cross. The inscription in a circular band on the seal tells it all: “*Our Lamb has conquered, let us follow Him.*” Jesus Christ conquered death by giving His life on the cross, that we might follow Him and have life everlasting.
