### Sabbatical Reflections: Gratitude

Now that my 4-week sabbatical has come and gone, and people have inquired about my experience. First, I am so grateful to the Lititz Moravian leadership for supporting me to take this time of rest. Second, my church family has been so helpful and supportive of my efforts to care for myself. Special thanks to Pastor Sayward for her strong encouragement to take the sabbatical. Without a doubt, my most important and sustaining feeling is one of gratitude. During my seventeen years of pastoral ministry, I was too busy to remove myself from the day-to-day ministry for an extended time. The times I took more than ten days off were during times of recovery after two surgeries. Thank you for giving me permission to rest, devote more time to prayer and reading, and address unfinished business.

Prayer and Reading

Two of the vows Moravian pastors take at their ordination are the following: A. Study the Holy Scriptures

B. Prayer
The reading of scripture and prayer is foundational for all pastors and yet, there can be a difference in this practice for the church and personal spiritual health. My time away allowed me to focus on me and my personal relationship with God. At times I was successful in not thinking about the work and needs of the congregation. It was difficult to not think about the ministry of the congregation, people on the prayer list, and calendar events. My spirit was restless the first two weeks as I tried not to be pastoral. I took this opportunity to write a journal and read.

#### Unfinished Business

It was special to relax on the beach with sand under my feet, the ocean in view, and the sound of the waves was much appreciated. Growing up in the flat lands of Indiana, the sight and sounds of the Atlantic never gets old. One of my goals was to visit one of my mentors. The Rt. Rev. Dr. Stanley Thomas was one of my father figures. Bishop Thomas and his wife Mrs. Faye Thomas were at Second Moravian Church when I was 8 to 18 years old. My Bishop is with the Lord, and I wanted to make a trip to New Jersey see one of my "mothers" who loved me and nurtured me. It was a great visit. Dee and I visited the resting place of her fifth grandfather Uncle Alfred a former slave of President Andrew Jackson. I went to Nashville, TN to visit the Hermitage and learn about the former president. We saw the tomb of President Jackson and his wife Rachel. To the right of the president's resting place is the grave of Alfred, all buried in an English Garden. In walking distance is the actual log cabin of Alfred. It was sobering to learn off all the enslaved and emancipated people, Alfred was the

In honor of our church's 275th Anniversary, we are inaugurating a church-wide service project: the expansion of our Lititz Moravian Community Garden. Since 2017, thanks to the leadership of Brenda Barnes, a small group has worked to fund and manage a modest, raised-bed garden near the pavilion which has provided much-needed fresh vegetables to our community food banks.

Donating fresh food actually helps serve two purposes for bettering communities. Aside from the immediate health benefits to our neighbors who depend on food assistance, the planet benefits greatly as well. The less unspoiled food that gets thrown away, the less unspoiled food that is sent to a landfill and goes to waste.

Now WE have the opportunity to fulfill Christ's call to serve! By expanding our garden significantly, we can honor our years as part of this community by producing a significant volume of fresh produce for those who are food deprived. The plan is to increase the number of raised beds and, consequently, the amount of produce raised, as well as offering our members the opportunity to participate in a service project that promises to improve the lives of many in our community.

There are a number of options for YOU to get involved:

- · Help assemble and fill the beds
- · Plant, water, weed, and harvest · Transport the produce to food bank
- · Plan to add some of your home-grown produce to the harvest
- · Solicit friends and neighbors to donate produce


