Yes, we will be making candles this year. Come to learn how we make the beeswax candles that fill our sanctuary with beautiful light. We meet every Thursday evening and Saturday Morning for 6 weeks We will begin by meeting to remove the wicks from used candles. We will meet in the candle Room. FEBRUARY 27, 2025 6:30 PM The next step begin on March 6, 2025 Candle room 6:30 PM Lots of hands are needed. First, some of us tie the wicks onto the rods. Second, some hook the wicks through the molds. Then, a few of us pour the wax into the molds. The final step happens on Saturday morning, March 8, 2025 Candle room 9AMThe candles are removed from the mold. The wicks are trimmed. The candles are "sized" to fit into the trays. READY FOR CHRISTMAS!!

A group is needed to take up the mantle of the Easter Sunrise Breakfast. If no group steps into that void, there will be no Easter Sunrise Breakfast in 2025.

#### Minutes from the September 10, 2024 Lititz Moravian Museum and Archives

Tom Wentzel shared an overview of early Moravian Brother Bernard Adam Grube known as the founder of the Collegium Musicum in Lititz. Also a Moravian missionary, teacher and preacher.

**Minutes:** The minutes from the September meeting were approved.

Departed Spirits Tour: All scripts are written for each character. The third floor barrier will be removed by Matt Good. Al Olah will be the candle tender with volunteers from LHF and LMC filling in all needed spots for the tours.

**Tours:** Warwick 2nd grade classes will tour the Moravian Archives and Museum. This is a traditional fall field trip. There has also been a steady stream of call in tours including an accomplished organist from Canada and a researcher from Brazil.

Repair/Maintenance: The informational map in front of the Brothers House is in need of repair. It was suggested the woodworkers at Moravian Manor be contacted. Also the cemetery arch is in need of attention. The Trustees are aware of this and will look into it. The front door entrance of the Brothers House is looking shabby and should be cleaned and sprayed with D2 to make the entrance look more inviting.

**Putz Carving Donation:** The Art Shoemakers would like to make a donation of two putz groupings carved and painted by them. It was decided to accept both. Tom will prepare the accessions paper work.

2025 Archives Budget: The budget item for the Collegium Musicum arose and some discussion ensued on our continued support of this initiative with archive funds. The committee came to a consensus that this is budget money well spent.

**Organ Recital:** It was reminded organist Roger Kurtz will perform Sunday, October 20, in the sanctuary. This is sponsored by the 275th committee.

Kitchen Renovation: In the next few weeks work will begin on our kitchen and dining area.
