Discerning Together: The Call Process

As we look to the future of ministry at Lititz Moravian Congregation, we are entering into a sacred and Spirit-led journey: the call process for a new pastor. This is not simply a hiring process—it is a time of prayerful discernment, mutual conversation, and faithful listening for God's guidance in identifying the right pastoral partner for our congregation and community.

The Moravian Church Northern Province follows a structured yet spiritually grounded call process, designed to match congregations and pastors in shared ministry. Here's an overview of what that process looks like for us:

Step 1: Congregational Preparation

The process begins with reflection. Our Joint Board (Elders and Trustees) works with a District President to assess the needs, vision, and ministry context of our church. During this time, members of the congregation may be invited to participate in surveys to help identify the qualities, gifts, and leadership style we seek in a pastor. This becomes the foundation for creating a Congregational Profile—a snapshot of who we are and who we hope to become.

Step 2: Reviewing Candidates, Discernment, and Issuing the Call

Once our profile is complete, the Joint Board is entrusted with the responsibility of reviewing candidate profiles, interviewing prospective pastors, and discerning which candidate might best fit our ministry needs and mission. The Eastern District provides the Joint Board with potential candidates—pastors who are open to new calls and who align with the needs outlined in our profile. The process is kept confidential within the Joint Board. Following an interview and prayerful consideration, the Joint Board can officially extend the call to the candidate.

Step 4: Announcing the Call

If the candidate accepts the call, the PEC and the Eastern District work with our congregation and the pastor to establish a timeline for the transition and installation. If the candidate does not accept, the Joint Board resumes the discernment process.

How Can You Be Involved?

This process invites every member of the Lititz Moravian Congregation to share insights during the survey phase, but most importantly, through prayer. Pray for our Joint Board, for potential candidates, for clarity and unity, and for God's continued guidance in our ministry.

If you have questions about the process, please contact any member of the Joint Board. The Joint Board's first informational meeting is September 16th.

LITITZ MORAVIAN MEADOW MORAVIAN WILDFLOWER MEADOW

You might be a Lititz Moravian congregant who has asked why there is a field of tall grass along the church driveway and Cedar Street.

It is phase one of establishing a meadow that will support local biodiversity, support pollinators, reduce stormwater runoff, reduce emissions and fossil-fuel dependence of gas mowers, reduce the workload of our volunteers (less time spent mowing), and support the endangered Monarch Butterfly and other insects.

There are differing methods to establish a meadow; and the simplest, most economical way is to stop mowing and monitor what will naturally grow.

Although we started phase one during 2024, the grass barely grew because of the drought. Spring and Summer of 2025, with all of its rain, finally established the basic meadow.

Phase two will include establishing wide pathways for strolling and observing, planting and sowing native perennials and wildflowers, and placement of signage so passers-by will know specifically what this area is (there were "no mow area" signs placed, but most of the signs came down during the winter). We hope to place benches for resting along the pathways.

As we continue to establish pathways, and plant and sow flowers, you will see the changes gradually take place; and you are encouraged to stroll through our meadow then and connect with God's beautiful creation. If you would like to donate wildflower seeds or native perennials, please reach out to a Cemetery Committee member or myself.


