THOUGHTS OF A Pastor's Mind

A Pumpkin Patch Surprise

Something unexpected has sprouted in our front flower garden: a pumpkin patch! None of us intentionally planted it, and yet here it is, growing strong and green, despite what seems to be a consistent invasion of thistles. Our best guess? Last fall, the squirrels made off with porch pumpkins and buried some seeds. Maybe a few made their way from a neighbor's field. However it happened, seeds that were left behind in unlikely soil have taken root, and now we have pumpkins on the way.

This surprise reminds me of one of Jesus' most beloved parables—the story of the Sower found in Matthew 13:3-9, Mark 4:2-9, and Luke 8:4-8. In that parable, a farmer scatters seed in every direction. Some fall on rocky ground, some among thorns, and some on good soil. The farmer has no control over where the seed lands, and yet in the places where the soil is right, the seed grows and produces a harvest—sometimes beyond anyone's expectation.

We don't always know what kind of soil we're planting into. We may assume a place—or even a person—is too hardened, too crowded with thorns, or too shallow for God's Word to take root. And yet, just like the squirrels' forgotten pumpkins, God has a way of surprising us. Seeds can grow in the most unlikely places. The Spirit moves, waters, and nourishes in ways we can't predict. What looked like barren ground may, in time, reveal a beautiful harvest.

Our little pumpkin patch is a living reminder that God is at work in ways beyond our planning and control. The Holy Spirit can bring forth life where we least expect it. So keep sowing kindness, faith, hope, and love. Even if you think the soil isn't ready, you never know what God might grow.

2025 Vigil Season

Christmas is a gift of God to be received and shared with joy. Like the beeswax candles we are given at our Christmas Vigils, we receive the light of Christ, and we raise the candles high to let His light shine not just in us, but through us. Our Christmas Vigils allow us to enjoy this most meaningful, beautiful service, and to share it with others. Please consider whom God has placed in your life-particularly those who might be without a church-and invite them to come to a Vigil service, with admission cards you could secure for them via the enclosed response card.

If you would like to invite someone new in this way, but customarily get admission cards for family or friends, we encourage you to let your family or friends know that they can get their tickets by sending a request with their phone number and a self-addressed stamped envelope, to the office by Friday, November 14. After that date, all non-member requests may be made at the public distribution. After the public distribution, non-member requests may be made in person at the church office. This way, they can continue to attend, and you can share a blessing for someone who has not attended before.

One of the six Vigils requires no admission cards: Family Lovefeast Candlelight Service Sunday, December 21, 10:30 a.m.

Five identical Vigil Services require admission cards: Saturday 20, 2024, at 5:00 pm & 7:30 pm Sunday, December 21, at 5:00 p.m.

Christmas Eve, Wednesday, December 24, at 5:00 p.m. & 7:30 p.m.

Admittance into the church begins one hour before the service, with special prelude music for the evening Vigils beginning about 30 minutes before the service. Enclosed is an admission request postcard. Information for completing the card can be found on the back of this letter. Please note the deadline, Friday, November 14, and respond by returning your completed card as soon as possible to avoid disappointment. To help us serve you best, please follow the instructions for use of the card exactly as stated.

Members will be able to choose either the traditional card or fill out a Google form to request tickets. Click for Ticket Requests Form Public distribution will have two options: traditional in-person and e-ticketing via Eventbrite.

The nursery will not be open during vigils.

Distribution of admission cards will take place in the Fellowship Hall following both the 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. worship services on Sunday, November 23, and Sunday, November 30. All admission cards not picked up by Sunday, November 30, after the 10:30 a.m. service, will be given to others unless alternate arrangements are made before that time by contacting the Church Office. Public e-ticketing will open on December 1.

2025 REQUEST CARD INSTRUCTIONS (Please read before completing)

Admission card request forms are to be filled out by church members only. Due to the limited seating capacity of the Sanctuary, the Board of Elders asks the requests be submitted only for those who are absolutely certain to use them. The selection of an acceptable second choice is essential for the Board of Elders to make a fair distribution.

Enclosed is one request card per household. In the middle upper section of the card, list the names of all family members within the household who are planning to attend the Vigil Service. Be certain to show the total number of first choices on the left-hand columns and second choices on the right, as indicated on the request card.

All other requests should be listed in the middle lower section of the request card, e.g. relatives and guests. Again, be certain to show the total number of first and second choices. Please list all persons requesting tickets by their full name. This is necessary to eliminate duplication and assure the fullest possible utilization of admission cards. Unnamed requests will not be honored. We ask that you request a maximum of two guests per member.

Friday, November 14, is the deadline for receiving all requests, including dieners, workers, soloists, choir members, etc. We may not be able to honor requests received after this date. If you are unable to pick up your admission cards after the 8:00 am or 10:30 am worship services on distribution dates of <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 23</u>, and <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 30</u>, please send a stamped self-addressed envelope with your request or make alternate arrangements by contacting the church office.

The Strategic Planning Committee (SPC) met via Zoom on August 28. During this meeting, the committee discussed launching a regular communication campaign—similar to the "Board Highlights" in The Spire—to keep the congregation updated on our progress.

With Pastor Mark's retirement, he will no longer sit on the committee after October 19th. If a new co-pastor is called while the SPC is still active, that pastor will join the planning process. If a call occurs after the SPC's work is complete, the new pastor will receive the finished Strategic Plan as part of Lititz Moravian's call materials.

The SPC also conducted a Spine Analysis of LMC and began examining our mission, vision, and values, including how these elements align and what might need to be refined to create a clearer, more concise expression of who we are as a congregation. To move this work forward, SPC has divided into three smaller groups to review mission, vision, and values in depth. These groups will meet individually before October 16, when the full SPC will gather again to review their work. An in-person session is scheduled for November 8 to set strategic priorities and next steps.



Highlights from the Board of Elders for September


- Volunteer worship assistants are lining up to assist Pastor Sayward this autumn.
