

GETHSEMANE A Lenten Sermon Series

In May, June, and July we'll enjoy vegetables that were nurtured in March greenhouses and flowers that were planted in early April. Someone will have taken the time to think about how they will best grow, what conditions they'll need, and when the right time to plant them is.

Gardens don't just happen—they take time, care, and intentionality. And just like that, Jesus' journey to Gethsemane didn't come out of the blue. From the dawn of creation and in every encounter of his human life, seeds were being planted for what would unfold in the garden.

In this six-week Lenten series, we'll walk through the events leading to Gethsemane, discovering how each moment was a piece of a larger story—foreshadowing the scene that would take place under the olive trees. From the Garden of Eden, the time of the exile, and to the interactions Jesus had with the disciples, each step was leading to this pivotal moment.

We invite you to reflect on how these key moments in Jesus' life—like seeds planted along the way—foreshadow our own moments of growth. Join us in this season of deepening faith, and be part of our church's journey of worship, service, learning, and community. Let's go to the garden together and see what Spring brings!
