Pastor's Note by Stina Koppes



"Dear brothers and sisters in Christ: the early Christians observed with great devotion the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection, and it became the custom of the Church that before the Easter celebration there should be a forty-day season of spiritual preparation. During this season converts to the faith were prepared for Holy Baptism. It was also a time when persons who committed serious sins and separated themselves from the community of faith were reconciled by penitence and forgiveness and restored to participation in the Church's life. In this way the whole congregation was reminded of the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ and the need we all have to renew our faith."

Fresh starts are the stuff of magazine covers, TV shows, and social media feeds. Advertising is built on the premise that we need to change something, buy something, fix something, or aspire to something to find happiness. Social media bombards us with algorithms intentionally created to affect our brains into consuming what we think we specifically need to "live our best life."

In the Christian tradition, fresh starts and "living our best life" are the stuff Ash Wednesday and Lent celebrates as well. Yet unlike an algorithm designed to convince our brains to buy more, Ash Wednesday rolls through like an urgent wake up call, shouting at us to repent, turn around, and change. When we receive the imposition of ashes, we often hear the famous phrase, "Remember you are dust and to dust you shall return." It can feel jarring and disorienting. It is meant to be. At its best, Ash Wednesday is meant to catch our attention and remind us to pay attention to what matters.

Instead of a call to consume more, the season of Lent (beginning with Ash Wednesday), is a call to release and reflect. We are encouraged to be counter-cultural. See what you can live without. Think about what you pay attention to and how it affects you. Be honest about what you really value and where your life is heading. It is uncomfortable. Yet it is also an invitation to soften the heart and open the door to an incredible outpouring of grace meant to remind us of the stuff we are made of – the image of God that rests deeply within us. It is a journey that refines our lives, burning away that which holds us back and strengthening the best within us.

As we prepare once more to celebrate Ash Wednesday, this year on February 14th, and embark on another Lenten journey....

"I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to observe a holy Lent: by self-examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self-denial; and by reading and meditating on God's Holy Word... " - The United Methodist Book of Worship

May it be a time of forgiveness, mercy, and renewal.

The United Methodist Church has its roots in the spiritual revival led by John Wesley in 18th century England. That heritage has two distinct aspects. We will speak to them and look at the church's Social Creed. We will also take time in worship to recognize our 2024 Senior High Mission Trip Team as we bless their upcoming work.

The United Methodist Church has a Social Creed that we will be talking about in worship on February 4th. That Creed is printed below. This is an opportunity to read it in advance and decide for yourself if you agree with it or if it can apply to you. We will be reading it during worship on February 4th. As you will hear that day the Social Creed is very much in the history and spirit of Methodism.

Our Social Creed

We believe in God, Creator of the world; and in Jesus Christ, the Redeemer of creation. We believe in the Holy Spirit, through whom we acknowledge God's gifts, and we repent of our sin in misusing these gifts to idolatrous ends.

We affirm the natural world as God's handiwork and dedicate ourselves to its preservation, enhancement, and faithful use by humankind.

We joyfully receive for ourselves and others the blessings of community, sexuality, marriage, and the family. We commit ourselves to the rights of men, women, children, youth, young adults, the aging, and people with disabilities; to improvement of the quality of life; and to the rights and dignity of all persons.

We believe in the right and duty of persons to work for the glory of God and the good of themselves and others and in the protection of their welfare in so doing; in the rights to property as a trust from God, collective bargaining, and responsible consumption; and in the elimination of economic and social distress. We dedicate ourselves to peace throughout the world, to the rule of justice and law among nations, and to individual freedom for all people of the world.

We believe in the present and final triumph of God's Word in human affairs and gladly accept our commission to manifest the life of the gospel in the world. Amen.

Join us as we meet a woman in Luke's gospel through the voice of a dramatic presentation by Krista Kemp. During worship, we will also celebrate the 2024 Faithful Servant Award recipients.



February 14 - Ash Wednesday

Psalm 51, Matthew 6:1-6, 16-21

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of the Christian season of Lent, which is a period of forty days set aside for spiritual renewal and preparation for Easter. Take time out of your week to pause, find refreshment, and start anew with God as we gather for worship on Ash Wednesday. Dinner will be offered from 5:30-6:30pm. Worship begins at 6:30pm in the sanctuary.

Partnering with YouthWorks (youthworks.com), our team will be immersed in experiences that seek to restore relationships, love others, and serve communities because Jesus set that example for us. Students may serve all or part of the week at a food shelf, clothing distribution center, or by assisting with painting, cleaning, or simple repair projects. We will also have the opportunity to experience local BBQ, visit a Lake Michigan beach, and explore Benton Harbor's sister city, St. Joseph. YouthWorks has partnered with this community since 2000.
