## **Pastor's Note** by Stina Koppes



"Listen, my son, to your father's instruction; don't neglect your mother's teaching; for they are a graceful wreath on your head, and beads for your neck."

#### ~ Proverbs 1:8-9

This winter we have been reflecting on Tough Love that is fueled by God and capable of sustaining relationships through better and worse. Whether it's loving our kids, our spouse, our neighbors, or ourselves, having tough love is something that is experienced over time. It is an embodied wisdom we gain from our elders, whether biological or spiritual parents. This month, I encourage you to spend time reflecting on the instructions and wisdom that have been passed down to you as well as the wisdom you want to pass along to future generations. What is it that matters most?

As you reflect on those instructions, I encourage you to think about the discipling, methods, and habits needed to keep that wisdom alive. This is a beautiful part of our United Methodist faith. We care about methods and practices. The disciplines and real habits that make our lives immersed in the grace of God are crucial for our spiritual health. So, as you think about the wisdom you want to pass along, I ask you to take things a step further. What are the habits you want to pass along? What about your life is worth modeling to others for the future? What habits need to change? What in your life needs to be reconsidered?

If you're feeling in a rut or looking for help, I recommend to you five life changing habits that are worth your time. I promise that each of these will bless your life and show you how to give and receive a tough love that will last through better and through worse. I hope these habits sound familiar from the fall.

### **Five Life Changing Christian Habits:**

- Worship/Prayer Pray 5 times a day. Worship once a week
- Study Read at least 5 verses of scripture a day
- Serve Pursue 5 acts of kindness a week
- Give Practice 5 acts of generosity a month
- Share (Witness) Share my faith with 5 people each year

Do these things and you will live. Through these ordinary practices God will have space to shape and transform your hearts to receive and share the kind of tough love you need.

#### Ephesians 5:15-33

Through this sacred intimacy, we understand what it means to help and be helped by another person that is "bone of our bone and flesh of our flesh" (Genesis 2). This week, we will focus on the love that deepens in a marriage over the years. How can we look to God to guide our marriage so that we can be faithful, "for better and worse."

#### February 16 - How Do Your Know Your Neighbor

#### Luke 10:25-28

Often we do not know our neighbors. That may mean we don't respect them or value them. Part of loving God is honoring our neighbors and that means being able to openly talk to them.

#### February 9 - What Do You Want For Your Marriage After 20 Years?

#### Hebrews 13:1-8

Research shows that marital bliss often dips dramatically after the first five years of marriage and may not rebound until much later in time. What does it take to strengthen a marriage to endure the hardships of life and be able to find happiness in your marriage when life is tough? What is your hope for your own marriage in 20 years from now? (Or for the marriages of your children?) Join us as we reflect on the habits needed to build a strong marriage that will last across the decades.

#### February 23 - What Do You Want For Your Enemies

#### Luke 6:27-38

We conclude our series with one of the toughest loves. Jesus admonishes us to "Love your enemies. Do good to those who hate you. Bless those who curse you. Pray for those who mistreat you." (Luke 6:27-28) How is it possible to show compassion to those who wish us harm or when our own hearts are filled with anger and rage?




What a joy to be together on Sundays AND Wednesdays! Here's what we are learning:



## Join Respectful Conversations about the Election Wednesday, February 19, 5:30-7:30pm

With all the news about the election we have so many emotions – and so much to respond to – that it's hard to know where to begin. When we do talk about the election we can leave feeling worse about the people we disagree with, and sometimes worse about ourselves.

There is a way to talk about it all that feels open and honest. You can actually speak freely, be heard, and be curious about people with other perspectives. Thousands of Minnesotans have participated in Respectful Conversations since 2012. These facilitated, structured conversations are designed not to change minds, but soften hearts on topics that divide us.

These communities have chosen to be sources of peace, cooling the heat of division and learning to be peacemakers. ## **Stitches of Love**

Crosswinds Church has been blessed to have a dedicated group of about 11 sewers who stitch together quilts, book bags, and feminine hygiene kits. Sewing is done in individual homes and the group meets every other month, except for summer, to discuss goals, progress and distribute materials. Meetings end in a prayer over the items that have been completed and for those who will receive them.

The cotton light weight quilts go to Midwest Mission and typically are sent to warm weather areas experiencing a disaster. We use the pattern supplied by Midwest Mission to fit the cots they provide. It takes approximately 6 yards of material to create each quilt. Retail cost of material per quilt is \$18-20 per quilt. We created approximately 130 quilts last year.

We also create book bags and they are distributed nationally and internationally. We sent approximately 30 bags last year and they cost \$1.50 each to make. A school in Peru was one of the recipients of bags last year.

A significant part of our work involves a partnership with the women of Maple Grove Rotary. We have stitched feminine hygiene kits in the past several years that are distributed through the Days for Girls organization. The Days for Girls organizations mission is to remove barriers to school attendance for girls. Period poverty is a term they use that describes the struggle many women and girls face in developing countries because they lack access to safe and affordable menstrual products. This challenges their ability to participate in school and the workplace because of absenteeism, wage loss and inconsistent focus on education. Our kits have gone to school girls in Kenya, Haiti, and Nigeria in past years. The Rotary Club provides parts of the kit, such as soap and some materials. The portion that Crosswinds provides costs approximately \$5.20 per kit. Last year we stitched and assembled 125 kits with a cost of approximately \$650. The Rotary Club works with other organizations to arrange for shipping and distribution of the kits.

New sewers are always welcome. We can accommodate varying skill levels. Contributions of clean cotton or flannel material is very much appreciated with pieces that are 1/2 yard or larger preferred. Fabric should not have animal pictures, political or patriotic designs, holiday, camouflage, or corporate logos. Funding this ongoing work is always the challenge so contributions are also appreciated. We are grateful to all who have solicited corporate grants or have given personally. We seek to improve the lives of those less fortunate one stitch at a time.
