Confirmation Goals & Expectations

For Confirmands (Students)

Confirmation is a **two-year journey through the Old and New Testaments**.

- Who can join: Teenagers in 7th–11th grade are welcome to begin. Both years must be completed back-to-back, since we alternate each year's focus (Old Testament one year, New Testament the next).
- Monthly Class Attendance: Be present at all scheduled Confirmation gatherings.
- **Building Blocks:** Complete the required **Old Testament Building Blocks** (includes memorizing Scripture, learning context, and explaining its importance).
- Worship Reflections: Turn in monthly reflections connected to Sunday worship.
- **Statement of Faith:** Write and submit a personal Statement of Faith at the end of the process.

For Parents

Your role is to **support and encourage** your student in their Confirmation journey.

- Partner in Building Blocks: Help your student complete the memorization and context work.
- **Worship Support:** Encourage your student to attend Sunday worship regularly and remind them to complete reflections during or after the service.
- **Statement of Faith Guidance:** Walk with your student as they think through and write their Statement of Faith.
 - The *process* is just as valuable as the finished product.
 - It's normal—and even encouraged—for their Statement of Faith to grow and change between Fall and Spring.

Confirmation Goals & Expectations

BUILDING BLOCKS

Each Building Block has three parts:

- 1. Memorize & Recite the Bible verse(s).
- 2. **Explain the Context**—describe the passage the verse is found in and what's happening around it.
- 3. Apply the Truth—share how the verse makes a difference in your own life.

Completion Requirements:

- Each Building Block must be recited twice on two different days to count as complete.
- A Building Block is complete only when all three parts (memorization, context, application) are clearly demonstrated.
- A Building Block can be signed off by: Parent(s), Small Group Leader(s), & Pastor Evan
- Students must show that they have memorized the verse and thoughtfully explained both context and application before it is approved.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

Purpose

Writing a Statement of Faith is not about producing a perfect paper or getting every theological detail "right." Instead, it's a chance for you to:

- Honestly reflect on what you believe about God.
- Practice putting your faith into words.
- Consider how your beliefs shape the way you live.

This should feel like both a challenge and an adventure—an opportunity to grow in your relationship with God.

Prompt

As you write, consider this guiding question:

What are three things you know to be true about God, where do you find these in the Bible, and how do those beliefs make a difference in your life?

Your Statement of Faith should be about **one page, double-spaced**. See the "Statement of Faith" page for tips, suggested outlines, and extra prompts to help you get started.

Timeline

- Fall Statement of Faith is due at our first January Confirmation class.
- Spring Statement of Faith is due at our May Confirmation class.
- Students completing Confirmation will **present their Statement of Faith** (live or recorded) on **Promotion Sunday**.

Supp<u>ort</u>

Don't write this alone, work with your parent(s), small group leaders, Pastor Evan, or a trusted mentor. They can ask good questions, offer perspective, and encourage you as you write.

Example Outline of a Statement of Faith

- 1) Introduction
 - a) Name & age
 - b) Two words to describe my relationship with Jesus and why I choose these words
- 2) God made himself known to us in and through Jesus
 - a) John 1:1-14
 - b) Colossians 2:9
 - c) It helps me understand who God is and how I should live by learning about Jesus
- 3) He's forgiven me of my sin & given me a new life because of Jesus' death & Resurrection
 - a) Ephesians 2:8-10
 - b) 1 Corinthians 15:1-4
 - c) I know how to forgive others, forgive myself, and love people because God shows his love and forgiveness to me!
- 4) God is faithful!
 - a) The story of God leading Israel in the wilderness
 - b) I can trust him in the hard times and the good times because he has proven that he will never leave me!
