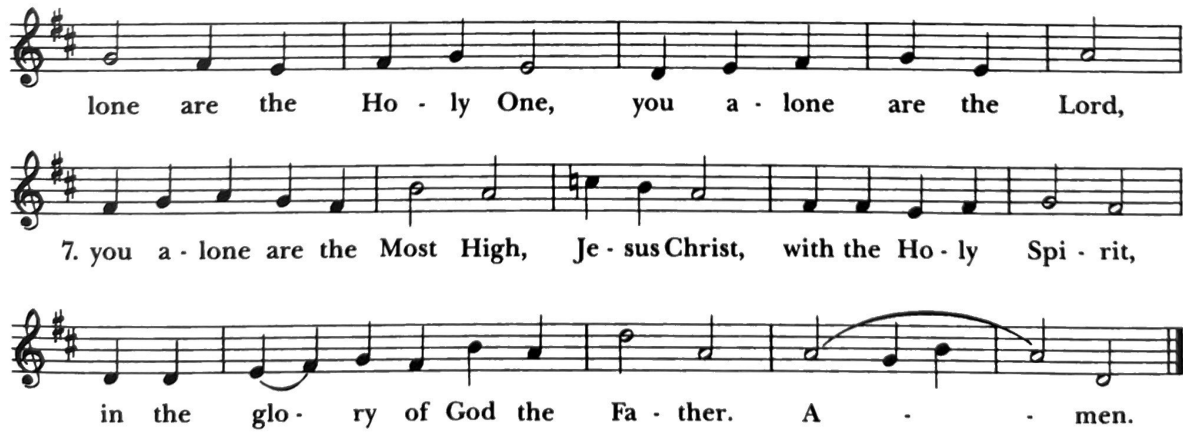

To receive Holy Communion:

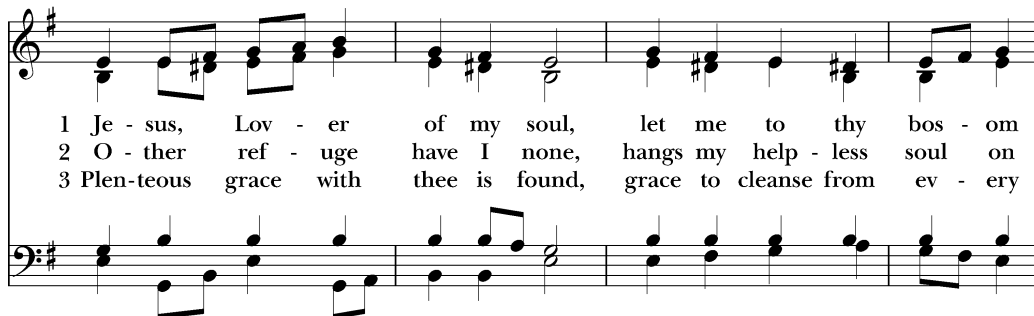
- *Come forward by rows and stand before the minister extend your hands to receive the host.*
