THE FIRST LESSON

JEREMIAH 15:15-21

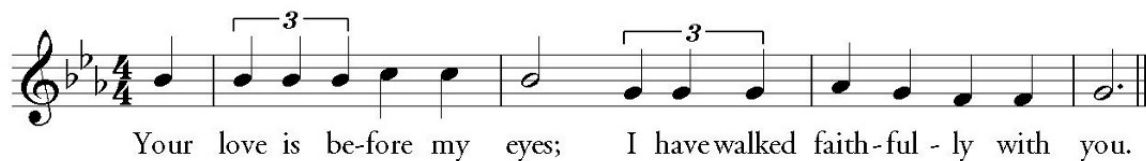

THE INVITATION

All baptized Christians are welcome to receive Communion at the Lord's Table. Those who do not wish to receive Communion are invited forward to receive a blessing; cross your arms over your chest so the minister will know to pray for you.

To receive Holy Communion:

- *Come forward by rows and stand before the minister extend your hands to receive the host.*

- *If you are unable to approach the altar, signal an usher and the Sacrament will be brought to you.*

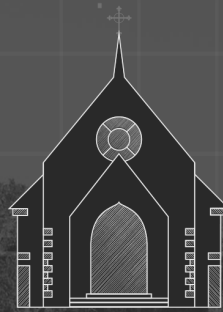

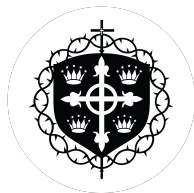
