Infant & Toddler Care

Nursery staff are well-trained, have required background checks, and will maintain a safe environment for your child(ren). Ask the nursery workers for a copy of our policies for more information. Across from the church office is a room for nursing mothers.

Children's Worship

Children's Worship is for children ages preschool through 2nd grade and meets in a worship space below the sanctuary during the sermon. This time is designed to prepare them for more fully participating in our liturgy when they are older. They are dismissed during the announcements and return during the offertory. New families are welcome to tour the space before or after a service if desired.


