Genesis is Our Origin Story



Genesis is our origin story.

That was the point of my sermon this past Sunday. It orients us and directs us. It reveals the source and the purpose of our blessings- our relationship with God.

This Sunday we will look at the 'first' creation story- from chapter 1 of Genesis. "In the beginning, God..."

There are many questions that this text does not want to answer. Like, how was light (day 1) created before the sun (day 4)? Rather, our task is to discover the questions that the text does want to answer- and frankly, those are the more interesting ones! Questions like:

- · What is the purpose of creation?
- · Why is the story of creation structured in days- evenings and mornings?
- · What is the relationship of God with creation?
- · What does it mean that humans are made in the 'image' of God?

What does it mean that God 'rested' after creating?

Where we begin determines where we end up! The first chapter of Genesis shows us that God brings order out of chaos, meaning out of mess. And God declares it all good.

Amen to that!

Teach Me Something!

All are invited! Adult Ed is sponsoring a Sunday morning Church-School series each week, with the theme, "Teach Me Something!" We are meeting in the Art & Soul classroom, continuing through August 24, with a wide variety of speakers and topics. This week Myrtie Cope will share her story with her presentation entitled, "My Photographic Journey."



Myrtie has been focusing on nature, landscape, and architectural photography since graduating from the photography program at Rocky Mountain School of Photography in 2008. She is honored to have photos in several private and public collections around Atlanta (including the Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta Airport and Emory University Hospital Tower) and internationally. Her winning images have been exhibited in the Julia Margaret Cameron Award for Women Photographers at Fotonostrum Gallery in Barcelona, Spain, for the past 3 years and will be exhibited again in 2026. Her newest body of work, "Nature Embroidered," was one of the projects featured in *All About Photo* magazine's nature issue in September 2023.

She received the Denis Diderot Artist-in-Residence grant at Chateau Orquevaux, France, in 2021 and received a second residency at Atelier AIR in Dangeau, France in 2023. Ms. Cope was awarded an artist residency as a Distinguished Fellow at Hambidge Center for Creative Arts and Sciences in March 2025 and will have solo exhibitions of her embroidered photographs at Southeastern Quilt and Textile Museum and Blue Heron Nature Preserve in 2025. Myrtie's undergraduate degree was in Interior Design at Florida State University, and she has been a member (twice) at NDBC since the 1980's.
