Opener

What is something you used to be amazed by but now don't even really think about it?

Read

Matthew 11:28; Mark 2:17; Luke 2:15; Colossians 1:15-20; Luke 2:20; Philippians 3:20; Psalm 95:1-2; Psalm 95:6; Psalm 100:1-2

Main Points

1. Faithful, joyful and triumphant are not the conditions by which we come to Jesus, they are the result of coming to Jesus. God sees who you will become long before you get there.
2. The shepherds were faithless, bitter, and defeated yet it was for them and to them that Jesus came.
3. Our heart must respond to what our mind knows.
4. It's entirely possible that we spend whole lot more worrying at Christmas than we do worshiping.
5. We can come and see, but the immediate and appropriate response is to come and sing, not just with our voices but with our hearts and lives with gratitude and awe.

- When was the first time you remember hearing of the story of Jesus, coming as a baby, living as a man, dying for your sins, and raising again to bring us to life in him?
- How has this truth impacted your life?
- What act of worship would remind you of Jesus this season?
- Where could you express Jesus and his love for you and others this week?
- Who has he brought into your life that you're realizing Jesus would like to share his love with them through you?
