Opener

What's your favorite Christmas Eve tradition?

Read

Luke 2:4-7; Galatians 4:4; Colossians 1:21-22;

Main Points

- 1. There are several different types of silence: awkward, respectful, sacred, relational, unexpected, digital, painful, and peaceful.
- 2. Though the journey to Bethlehem was anything but silent, calm or bright the birth of Jesus would bring peaceful silence into the chaos of the world and of our soul.
- 3. God is always working, whether see or unseen, heard or unheard. Before that *silent night* in Bethlehem, there were 400 years of silent nights where no word from God was spoken. God was preparing the earth to receive his son and spread his message. For 4 centuries, he was readying the world for the Son of God to enter.
- 4. Heaven's silence was broken through the cry of a baby the baby.

- What do you typically do when you feel God is silent in your life?

- To whom might God want to love through you whether through words or even just listening?
