

## When We Move

- What is one thing that stood out to you from this week's message?
- Everyone Answer: Outside of church, has there been an organization that you would say has had a big impact on our world?
  - Was that impact positive or negative?
  - How is that impact still affecting our world today?
  - What do you think it was that propelled that organization to have such a big impact while so many other organizations have such little impact?
  - In his teaching, Pastor Dave contrasted the church as a *movement* verses an *institution*. Which side do you think you naturally lean toward? Why?
  - Use your phone: Look up how the movement of Christianity has impacted our world historically.
- Read as a group Joshua 6:1-5
  - The wall of Jericho was a major, almost impossible, obstacle for the Israelites on their way to the promised land. What is a "Jericho" in your faith journey today?
  - Joshua 6:2 says, "See, I have delivered Jericho into your hands." How do your current perceptions sometimes keep you from believing God's promises?
  - The plan to overtake Jericho must have sounded ludicrous, but God was showing the Israelites how to have faith in what he can do. Hebrews 11:1 talks about faith being, "confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see." Where is God asking you to trust Him beyond what you can see?
- In his teaching, Pastor Dave taught us that all throughout scripture we are called to different levels of movement. We are called to "walk, keep step, run, wake up, and go". Do any of these descriptions apply to your current movement in faith? If so, which one and why? If not, why not?
  - Brainstorm the steps the Israelites must have had to take to realize the promise of God as it pertains to Jericho. What may have been holding them back from taking those steps? What if they had not moved in step with the guiding of the Spirit?
  - What step of faith or surrender could you take this week to "move" with God?
  - Pray: Invite group members to share their "Jericho" and pray for one another, asking God to remove obstacles and lead each person deeper into His movement.
