- What stood out to you from last Sunday's teaching?

- Read Luke 11:29-32
 - What do you know about the story of Jonah?
 - Flip your bibles over to the book of Jonah. It isn't a long book. Skim through and make a basic timeline of the narrative as a group.
 - How did Jonah's encounter with the big fish change his life?
 - What signs of obedience did Jonah exhibit after spending 3 days inside the big fish?
 - In chapter 4 we see that though Jonah was obedient to God, he wasn't always happy with God. A life of obedience doesn't necessarily mean you accept everything without question. What areas of your life are you struggling with in being obedient to God?
- Considering the timeline you just made... What would you say is "the sign of Jonah" that Jesus is referencing?
 - What are some ways the Jesus is like Jonah and what are some ways that they are different?
 - Why do you think that Jesus twice referenced the work of Jonah as a sign pointing to Him?

Jesus is a figure who embraces the radically broad love envisaged in the book of Jonah—a love that includes the salvation of Jews and Gentiles. Jesus compares his ministry to that of Jonah: For as Jonah was a sign to the Ninevites, so also will the Son of Man be to this generation.
