How has LGPC have been loving our neighbors lately? We support about 20 mission partners locally and globally. Following is just a snapshot of what has happened in the last few months.



Did you know?....

...that the annual collection for Care and Share at Christmas raises enough money to purchase food for 100 families at Christmas and then 12 families every month? This Ministry has been active and grown over the last 40 years. We are always looking for more volunteers for this effort --drivers and packers.

...that the recipient of our World Communion Sunday collection was Christian Mission to Gaza? **Over \$8500.00** was collected and sent to the organization to help alleviate suffering in that devastated region.

...that a small, dedicated crew of 6-8 individuals from our church prepare and serve a monthly meal to the women and children of Shepherd's Door? Another team does the same thing for the downtown Salvation Army shelter.

More volunteers are welcome!

...that 62 families were served with gifts for 142 children by your efforts in partnership with Angel Tree Ministry? ...that we donated \$5000 to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Program to support relief efforts in the wake of Hurricane Helene and Hurricane Milton, and \$10,000 to food relief in Ukraine?

...that a new Senegal GoTeam has been formed to travel in the next few months to support the efforts of our three partners there? Among other things, they will visit the school at Beer Sheba, for which you gave over \$30,000 last year to build a new classroom!

...that we continue to support two refugee families from Afghanistan as they create new lives here in the Portland Metro area?

And this is just a sampling of recent happenings. God bless and keep you as you remember our Mission partners in prayer. There are Mission booklets in the gathering area that list each of the ministries. 2025 MISSION GOTEAM SPOTLIGHTS


Since 2013, following a fruitful 19 year relationship with World Vision in Senegal, we have partnered with 3 offshoot ministries.

The "Way of Righteousness" (Wolof: Yoonu Njub) ministry, led by Malick and Feluine Fall. This church-based ministry runs a Christian school for girls, helps oppressed Muslim boys, visits prisoners, offers retreats, and has a radio ministry, always with the goal of sharing the Gospel with the Wolof people of Senegal.

- - We also support long-time associate Leopold Diouf who works with Development Associates International (DAI). He visits the former "Lake Grove Land" villages to share the Good News

We are excited to be sending a well rounded team of staff and LGPC Members to Senegal this February to visit these three ministries as we continue to build relationships and share the gospel with the people of Senegal. Please be in prayer for our team as they prepare to depart near the end of February.

Agros is a Christian development organization that works to end generational poverty in Central America through land ownership, market-let agriculture, health and well being, financial empowerment, and education. Since 2010 Lake Grove has supported Agros by sending mission teams, providing financial donations, and praying for Agros families and staff.
