

MISSION OUTREACH—that's what we call Lake Grove's ministry to people in need out beyond the walls of our church buildings... "out there". We reach out to people who need food, water, and shelter. And we reach out in Jesus' name, because they all need the love of Christ as well. ***Everyone who donates to the church is part of this outreach, and we encourage everyone at the church to adopt at least one partnership to pray or volunteer for.*** It might be volunteering at one of the shelters we support, or sponsoring a child in Zambia, or helping deliver food to those who need it.

After 4 years of sponsoring two Afghan refugee families, we celebrated their self-sufficiency. There is still a steep road ahead of them, but we thank God that they can now move on without the assistance of the church.

LAKE GROVE YOUTH IS A WELCOMING COMMUNITY

where every student is invited to experience the love of Jesus and feel a true sense of belonging. It is a space designed for students to have fun, build meaningful relationships, and grow closer to Jesus in new and engaging ways.

Mid-June, Laura Fuller (Lead Director of Discipleship) stepped in to take leadership of the Youth Ministry while a search began for a new Youth Director—that search is ongoing. We are deeply grateful for our dedicated core of volunteers whose leadership helps our Sunday morning Youth Gatherings and Sunday night Youth Group flourish. On Sunday mornings, LGY students engage with the same sermon series as the congregation through age-appropriate lessons and fellowship. On Sunday evenings, students in grades 6–12 come together for dinner, games, community, and a lesson centered on faith and life. This fall, we used resources from the Fuller Youth Institute to explore topics such as compassion and anxiety through the lens of faith in Jesus.

Throughout the year, students have enjoyed a variety of fun and community-building events, including Winter Retreats, baking challah bread for Passover, rafting trips with our mission partners at YD Adventures, and festive celebrations during the fall season and Advent—LGY even got to light an Advent candle in the Modern service. Beyond these events, our youth have been actively serving both within the church and in the wider community. Highlights include a high school summer mission trip to Florida with Praying Pelican Missions serving the hungry and houseless, helping serve at the Women’s Advent Dessert, and supporting many Lake Grove Kids activities.

Noah's Ark offered a monthly chapel for teachers, students, and their families. Family Chapel Time included worship through singing, story, and prayer. Ms. Susan led the chapel time with support from Abby Krawson, Jean Brunson, and the LGK Team.

KINDER PREP CLASS

Noah's Ark expanded by bringing back its bridge class in the fall for children who would benefit from another year before kindergarten. These students thrived under Ms. Sarah Sievert's teaching as she prepared them for the next steps in their education. Noah's Ark Preschool will continue to offer its unique kindergarten preparatory class and curriculum.

THE LGPC LIBRARY supports the mission and teachings of Lake Grove Presbyterian Church by providing books and trusted resource recommendations that encourage people of all ages to grow in Christian faith and appreciation of Christian literature. The online catalog, available through the LGPC website, allows users to search by topic, title, or author and request items for pickup at the Reception Desk. Library use continues to recover following the Covid shutdown and is promoted through displays in the Gathering Area. New materials come from purchases, staff recommendations, Amazon Wishlist donations, and general donations, with all donated items reviewed for relevance, alignment with LGPC values, condition, and timeliness before being added to the collection, placed on the Free Cart, or donated to Goodwill.

MEN'S MINISTRY EVENTS

Men's Ministry sought to "create a supportive community where men can deepen their faith, strengthen relationships with their brothers in Christ, and actively serve others. LGMM aspires to empower all participants to grow in their walk with God and to live out their faith with purpose and integrity."

- 45 men at **Shoulder to Shoulder** half-day retreat exploring intergenerational lives of faith.
- 60 men attended **Shrove Tuesday Pancake Supper**; a related **Lenten Devotional** was created for the men to utilize throughout the season.
- 111 attended **Oktobeerfest**
- 100 men at **Advent Breakfast**

WOMEN'S MINISTRY EVENTS

Women's Ministry leaned into its mission of "encouraging women's spiritual, personal, and social lives through service and education" by sponsoring a number of successful events throughout the year:

- **Summer: Timbers soccer fellowship outing**
- **Fall: potluck** featuring Jeannine Graham as speaker
- **Winter: Valentines for shut-ins, Advent Dessert** (170 ladies!); Advent craft with LGK; and Caroling

MUSIC MINISTRIES AT LGPC
REMAIN A VITAL PART of the church's worship, care, and witness. Throughout the year, more than 200 participants of all ages lead worship and share their faith through music. Through rehearsals, workshops, and music mission trips, the ministry nurtures spiritual growth, musical development, and Christian fellowship. We are grateful for all God has enabled us to do together.

8 AM/9:30 AM MODERN WORSHIP

The Fellowship Hall services continued to grow in depth and devotion, providing consistent worship, meaningful fellowship, comfort in difficult seasons, and thoughtful engagement with a complex world. A key milestone was the launch of our first modern music concert, Songs for These Times, reflecting the voice of this community. Highlights included Easter, Special Music Sunday at the start of Advent, and the 3:30 PM Christmas Eve service, each featuring a full band and strong congregational participation.

CHILDREN & YOUTH CHOIRS

Children and youth choirs continued to grow in both size and musical skill. Joy Choir nurtured our youngest singers, highlighted by shared performances on Musician Commissioning and Palm Sunday. Hope and Peace Choirs participated in the Lake Grove Concert Series, including Tapestry and Requiem for the Living. Youth and children also led worship at services such as Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, and Christmas Worship through Music. The second annual musical theater camp was offered to the community and was another great success.



COVENANT BELS

Covenant Bells enjoyed a strong year in 2025, regularly enhancing monthly communion services and offering musical testimony. Highlights included a Maundy Thursday performance of Gethsemane by former member Nancy Hascall (now deceased), ensemble performances in January and June, and participation in a Salem handbell festival led by Cathy Moklebust. The year concluded with the 25th annual Bells and Brass concert in December, again performed twice due to strong attendance.

THE SANCTUARY CHOIR

Throughout 2025, the Choir led worship with music that reflected the depth of our faith and supported the message of each service. Highlights included Good Friday and Easter, the spring concert Requiem for the Living, A World of Carols for Worship through Music Sunday, and moving Christmas Eve services. Collaborations with guest musicians, including members of the Oregon Symphony, Pam Baker, Dorcas Smith, and other artists, enriched both worship and community life.

CONCERT SERIES

In 2025, the Lake Grove Concert Series continued welcoming the community with family-friendly, world-class performances. Along with the Sanctuary Choir spring concerts and Bells and Brass, highlights included Tapestry, an original program by Abigail Krawson and LaRiche Lamar, and a keyboard concert by Jeff Wood. The series reached over 3,000 people in person and online and raised more than \$10,000 for mission partners in Portland and Zambia.
