

**Reverend Greg Allen-Pickett** is a pastor, teacher, and leader with a passion for helping churches grow in faith, deepen their witness, and engage their communities with the love of Christ. Since 2017, he has served as Senior Pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Hastings, Nebraska, where he has worked alongside a vibrant congregation to strengthen worship, expand mission partnerships, and cultivate a spirit of discipleship and community engagement. He previously served as Associate Pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Atlanta, Georgia, providing strategic leadership and direction for global mission efforts in Haiti, Cuba, Brazil, Kenya, and Jamaica.



Greg's ministry reflects a deep commitment to both local and global mission. Early in his career, he worked on community development projects focused on water access, education, and micro-business in Ecuador, Mexico, Guatemala, and Denver. Those experiences continue to shape his belief that mission is most faithful when it is rooted in relationships, mutuality, and shared learning. He has since led more than 20 mission trips and remains passionate about helping congregations discover how God is already at work in their communities and around the world.

He also brings a deep appreciation for music in the life of the church. Greg sang in choir in high school, college, and within the church, and he values music as a vital expression of worship, faith formation, and community-building. He believes music has a unique ability to draw people into God's presence and to connect the church more deeply with one another and the wider community.

In addition to his congregational leadership, Greg has served in executive roles within the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), including as General Manager of Presbyterian World Mission, providing operational leadership and mentoring a team of domestic and international staff, and as Field Operations Manager at Healing Waters International, overseeing staff, operations, and budget. He has also taught as an adjunct professor in Spanish, political science, and sustainable development. He is a frequent preacher and speaker at conferences such as Montreat and Stewardship Kaleidoscope, and a regular contributor to Presbyterian Outlook. His forthcoming book, *Purple Church, Red State: Finding Common Ground in an Age of Polarization*, reflects his commitment to helping congregations navigate division with grace, courage, and faith.

Greg also feels a strong call to help the church bear faithful witness in a divided world. Through his preaching, writing, and leadership, he seeks to cultivate communities shaped by grace, compassion, and reconciliation—places where people can grow in faith while learning to love their neighbors across differences.

He holds a bachelor's degree in Spanish and Political Science from Pacific Lutheran University in Tacoma, a Master of Divinity from Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary, as well as master's degrees in Global Studies from the University of Denver and in Cultural Studies from Universidad del Azuay in Ecuador.

Greg is married to Dr. Jessica Allen-Pickett, and together they have one daughter, Esther. As a family, they enjoy traveling, the outdoors, and sharing life around the table with friends and neighbors.
