CATHY BLACKWOOD Bookkeeper I have a question for you as we enter April and begin the journey of the second half of Lent. Are you ready to "Read with Us" again? Many of you read the Bible with us in 2024. It was a powerful experience for me, Pastor Dawn, and Pastor Kerry as we preached through the Bible. I have heard from many of you about the great God moments you had and the things you learned. I also heard that many of you are reading Bible Recap again in 2025! The Bible Recap is truly an amazing resource. Sara and I are reading it again as well, as it will probably become a part of my yearly study of scripture.

One thing that stood out to me, especially as we entered into reading the New Testament, was how quick we read through the material. It seemed like the gospels flew by as well as Paul's letters. Each week we would have multiple places within the books to choose to preach and I for one felt like I would have liked to slow down and spend more time in the New Testament after what seemed like a long time in the minor prophets of the Old Testament.

As your clergy team has reflected on last year we too would have like to have taken more time to reflect on the different books. We also miss preaching on a Bible reading plan. To be honest, it was a rewarding challenge each week to preach on what we had all read. We have missed doing that in 2025. So, we have decided to read the New Testament again. This time though, we want to read less chapters a day and take time to reflect on what God is trying to speak to us.

Beginning the Monday after Easter, April 21, we are asking you to read the New Testament with your clergy team. We are creating our own reading plan which will do a few things:

1.) You will read less a day.

The reading plan will normally be two chapters a day.

2.) We will read the Bible in the traditional book setting way.

This means we will not read chronologically but take each book as it comes.

3.) We will begin Acts the weekend before Pentecost.

This will give us the spring to read the gospels and the summer for the rest of the New Testament. I believe this plan, which again begins April 21, will allow us to preach on not only passages but even book themes.

I know that spring and summer are busy times for everyone. It seems this was the most challenging time period for people in reading the Bible Recap. Therefore the shorter time commitment for each day's reading should make it easier to keep up. Plus, we are taking Sundays as a break day each week, which will allow a day to catch up on reading.

I am excited about the reading plan and the sermon series, entitled Summer Reading. Please plan to join us beginning April 21. You will be able to pick up a reading plan at the Information booth in the atrium or access the plan online. What I am really excited about is the opportunity to read and reflect on scripture again with you. God really moved and honored our commitment to His Word. I am excited to see what God will do <u>again</u> this summer!

# NOTES FROM THE MINISTRY OF THE TOWEL

Acts 11:26 "The disciples were first called Christians at Antioch."

It is recorded in the book of Acts that the Christians first acquired their name in the city of Antioch which is a city in Syria. This is recorded in Acts Chapter 11 verse 26. The term Christian in the Greek means a "follower of Christ." The term was likely coined by non-Christian gentiles. The suffix "ian" is Latin and means "of the party of." The term may have been used sarcastically or divisively. Whatever way it was meant the followers of Jesus decided that the name fit and adopted the name Christian or followers of Christ.

We know that names are important, and they identify us within the context of our family, our organization, and the state in which we reside. Whatever name we carry it signifies that we identify with that group in some way or another.

Lent is the season that we as Christians celebrate because we identify with the death and resurrection of Christ. It is the time for us to reflect, repent, renew, rehearse, and ready ourselves for the journey that we take towards the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday.

On Ash Wednesday we meet for a service where the cross is placed on our forehead. It is a service that reminds us of the sacrifice that our Savior made for us so that we can have a relationship with him. The cross on our forehead is an identifiable symbol recognized worldwide. It identifies our faith where we believe our Savior suffered a cruel death giving his life, so that we might have life.

During this Lenten season let us remember to not only reflect but also to renew our sense of connection as "followers of Christ." We can do that through prayer and fasting, special giving, and through a time of repentance.

As followers, we recognize that our identity is connected to Christ through the work that He did on the cross. But also, our identity as Christians connects us to one another, brothers and sisters in Christ. We should value each other as the name implies, followers and identifiers with our risen Savior Jesus Christ our Lord.


