Pastor Dawn and I have been preaching from the book The Emotionally Healthy Church by Peter Scazzero while Rob our senior pastor is on sabbatical. The book outlined strategies for discipleship that change lives and heals the wounds from past experiences that may impact our relationship with Christ and others.

What does it mean for us to be emotionally healthy people? In the context of our walk of faith what does it mean for us to be emotionally healthy Christians? It doesn't matter who we are, we bring with us into our salvation experience our past experiences and the DNA that we inherited from our parents. It is the makeup of who we are. It represents our personality, our traits, our behaviors, our looks, and it also demonstrates our values, and our belief sets that we've acquired along the way through our upbringing and the experiences we've had.

The apostle Paul tells us in Second Corinthians chapter 5 verses 17 through 21 "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting our sins against us. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

This passage speaks to what we refer to sometimes as a rebirth. We have been made into a new creation in Christ Jesus. The reconciliation that takes place in the relationship between us and God through Christ is one that comes with a blessing of healing and restoration. Because Christ became the forerunner of our salvation, he invites us to come into the blessedness of a relationship with him so that he can work his work in us to make us new creations in Christ Jesus. What that says to us is all the past experiences, the brokenness, the trauma, the propensities from our upbringing, and whatever we might have inherited through the genetics of our parents can be brought into the Kingdom of God so that Christ can become the Restorer of our brokenness.

This passage also tells us that we too have been called into a ministry of reconciliation or restoration. The ministry of congregational care should be a ministry where we are seeking to help people walk through their brokenness and find healing. That requires skills of knowledge and awareness on how to come alongside people in their brokenness and walk with them through healing. We here at Central continue to offer classes to teach you how to utilize skill sets that will support people that are in a place of suffering, grief, shame, and woundedness so that we can support them and pray for them and come alongside them to be with them as Christ does his internal work of healing.

Let us always be a church with a mission that recognizes the ministry of reconciliation so that we're doing our part in Christ Jesus to help broken people find healing. Let this always be our primary ministry of congregational care here at Central United Methodist Church.


