CATHY BLACKWOOD Bookkeeper I love a top "something" list. I am a kid of the 80s who used to listen to the weekly top 40 every week. You can still listen to those on SiriusXM's 80s channel, and I find myself doing that fairly often. But I love to rank things. I love to create top fives and top 10 lists. Several years ago after many failed attempts to journal, I started my daily top five. This is an exercise where at either the end of the day or the beginning of the next day, I write down the top five things that happened to me. I started doing this when I was going through a difficult time in my life and so I would focus on Things to be thankful for or just good things that I observed.

I have been doing this now for many years. Yet, I have had stretches during the last several years where I didn't do them. So regretfully I do not a have top five list going all the way back to 2008, which is when I began. But I have a lot of them. And the full process includes a weekly top five, monthly, quarterly and yearly. I think you get the point, top five for every period of time of the year.

So, as I was thinking about the May newsletter article, I thought it would be fun to give you my top five Lenten moments for 2025. We had a really great season of Lent and I thought it would be a fun way to highlight several of the great moments.

Lent Top Five Moments (not in any specific order)

5. Ash Wednesday video with Katie Emery and Mason Carter

We wanted to get out Lenten challenges to the congregation as Ash Wednesday was concluding. Katie had a challenge for her parents about trying out Sunday School as a way to add something on for the season of Lent. I wanted to give some more information about the 30 Pieces of Silver challenge. The encouragement of the Cornerstone Class to the church to bring "thirty pieces of Silver" to help raise money for the Way Station was another great moment. Mason Carter wanted to tell the church about a way to pray for the youth of the church through Pray Gravity. I was so impressed with Mason who did the video in one take. What a great way to close out the Ash Wednesday services.

4. 30 Pieces of Silver video by Thomas Szczepanek

I have already mentioned the great challenge from Lay Bennett and the Cornerstone Class for people to bring "30 pieces of Silver" to help with a key mission. During a staff meeting someone pulled up a Facebook post by the Szczepanek family featuring their youngest, Thomas. He explained the 30 Pieces of Silver challenge in a beautiful way and we knew we had to feature the video in a worship service. His mother, Melissa, gave us the go ahead and it was one of the most talked about announcements of Lent.

3. Teaching Prayer during Sunday School

So this is my top five list I am sharing. I have not polled the congregation or staff. One of my favorite parts of Lent was teaching a class on prayer during the Sunday school hour. It was a bit challenging to get there on time and then to make it back to worship ready to go. But there were not any major hiccups. I was able to teach a good group about what I have been learning about prayer. I had some amazing conversations throughout the season with those who attended. I also got to hear how God is answering prayer in our people's lives, which thrilled my heart.

2. Confirmation Conversations

During Lent Lucy Swanson leads our Confirmation program with 8th graders and mentors selected from our church family. I love helping to teach Confirmation each year. But my favorite part is the private conversations I have with the confirmands about their faith commitment. I get the incredible opportunity to ask each one of them if they are ready to confirm their faith before the church family. This year was awesome once again as each one looked me in the eyes with confidence and told me they were ready. One even said before I asked, that she was confident and ready to do this. WOW! That right there is why I am a minister to hear, "I am confident in my decision for Christ, let's do this!"

1. Holy Saturday.

I have been talking with John Beall about this service for a long time. It worried me that it was Saturday night before Easter. But it was so worth it. We gathered outside where a bon fire had been lit. We then lit the Paschal Candle which signifies the light of Christ. I then had the amazing opportunity to carry the light into the darkened chapel from the Holy Week services, and proclaim that Jesus Christ was risen! After the entrance we were able to celebrate a baptism of one of our confirmands. This was the practice of the early church and was awesome to connect to such an amazing tradition.

So, there you have it. This was your Sr. Pastor's Top Five moments of the Lenten Season. Maybe Holy Saturday doesn't fully qualify because it is sundown on Saturday night, which in the Jewish tradition began Easter Sunday. But I'll go with how we count the start of Easter and include it. The Holy Vigil was a huge addition to our Holy Week experience.

A special thank you to all of our amazing staff, church leaders and church members. It was a great Lenten and Easter season. I look forward to many more amazing moments as we move through the church calander together!

In March, we hosted our second Camp Way Maker! This was an Accessible Worship Arts Camp specifically designed for people of neurodiversity. This spring session was crafted for participants ages 15+. They focused their day on embracing God's truth and being fully present as a Disciple of Christ. As our participants gathered for morning check-in, one thing was clear: God's joy and goodness were radiating in these young people. We started our day with prayer and fellowship before heading to our first class, Visual Worship Art! Participants created their very own treasure box the inside was decorated with things that symbolized their own personal relationship with God and the outside was decorated to symbolize the gifts they share with others. Our next class was Worship Dance. It was incredible to see how each person expressed themselves and leaned into the full body experience of worshiping God with abandon! We had Music and Worship up next where students made the most joyful noise and learned the skills of a Worship Leader. One of our last classes of the day was Testimony and Scripture. In this class, students selected a "life verse" and learned how to deliver scripture with confidence to a congregation. They then took that life verse and created personal testimony about where they felt God had placed a calling on their heart. We can't wait till the next camp session!



NOTES FROM THE MINISTRY OF THE TOWEL

Psalm 119: 105 tells us God's word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path. This Psalm is telling us that God's word can guide and illuminate our lives to provide us direction and clarity. God's word is a source of guidance and truth. Therefore, the study of God's word should hold a prominent place in our reading and study life.

I think we all recognize the importance of studying God's word on a consistent basis. Our Bible should be a valuable tool that we use extensively in study and reflection.

Last Sunday I was asked to preach at Living Water United Methodist Church. While I was upfront preparing to preach my sermon I asked the congregation a question, "How many of you brought your Bibles today?" The reason why I asked the question is because I was going to read several scriptures out of the book of Hebrews and I felt like it was important for the congregation to be able to turn in their Bible and follow along.

After I asked the question, I was shocked that not one person raised their hand. Now I am not sharing all of this as a chastisement to this congregation. I know that many of us including myself have apps on our phone where we can just turn to the scripture and read a passage of scripture from the Bible app. The person who did the scripture reading for my sermon came forward and read the scripture from his phone. And I commented to the congregation how much we rely on technology these days in our services and that I was preaching my sermon from my iPad.

Later, I told my wife Kelli who was also sitting in the congregation on the front row that no one raised their hand when I asked the question about bringing their Bible to church. And then I said, "I wonder how many people today actually bring a Bible with them to church." I continued, "We have a society that loves convenience, and it is much more convenient to bring our phone with us to church and read the scripture the minister is using from our phones." Or many times the scripture just appears on the overhead screen.

I told Kelli I see a problem with this. Back in the day, when we brought our Bibles to church, our Bibles became a place where we could make notes and highlight various passages of scriptures so we could go back and study them again and see our notes. Our Bibles became for us a living witness and testimony to sermons and scriptures and subject matter that would inspire us. I said, "We don't have that opportunity on our phones and I believe the church is missing something when we do not have a Bible with, us so we can make notes about the meaning of a scripture being shared either in a Bible study or a sermon."

In no way am I trying to lay a guilt trip on any of you about whether you use your phone or bring your Bible to church. This is just me sort of wondering out loud whether it would be more beneficial if we got back to the old school way of bringing our Bibles to church with us so when we open the passage of scripture we know where it's at, we see it, we read it, and we have a pen with us to write notes that will serve us later in our own study and devotional time.

Kelli's response was, "Well, on my phone's app I can take notes on my app about that Bible passage." I ask, "How often do you go back to those notes to reread them to see them in your app?" Her response was, "Not very often." I think when we carry our Bibles with us, the word of God is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path and we use it for study, and we write notes and thoughts, we glean more from God's word. As we spend time in God's word reading a scripture passage, I believe we will get more out of it. I would encourage you to bring your Bible to church with you, not just the app on your phone. (Rebuttals are welcome!)
