

THE EPIPHANY OF THE LORD GOSPEL MEDITATION

A stranger in a foreign land, I was exhausted and homesick as my summer Spanish immersion ended in Guatemala. The rusty minivan arriving outside my small residence filled me with joyful hope. I was flying home to the U.S. and would be, at long last, completely happy. Or so I thought. After about half an hour of being home, I thought to myself, "This place is boring. I want to go somewhere." So I hopped in my car and left to see my friends. As I drove, I wistfully wondered, "Where am I truly at home?"

The feast of Epiphany has a lot to do with our notion of home. Where is our origin? Where are we going? When is our wandering done? Saint Matthew tells us of the Magi, "They were overjoyed at seeing the star." This star will bring them home, to a place where their questing will end, and they will be satisfied. Their real home is neither in the East nor in the earthly Jerusalem. Somehow, their home is wherever this boy and his parents are.

If you're a teenager or older, you probably know by now that every physical home we have is temporary. So we look up at the countless stars in our proverbial skies: things which bedazzle and beckon us to follow toward peace. The Gospel invites us to behold that — at long last — God has sent us a star to follow home, one that whispers, "Follow me! I will take you home!" Perhaps that star is your spouse. A friend. An opportunity. A cause. An intuition about a new direction. A prayer group. What is it for you? How will you know? It will lead you to Mary and Joseph and their son, and you will be home.

A STEWARDSHIP PRAYER for the New Year

Heavenly Father,

Thank you for the gift of a new year. You have entrusted us with the coming days, weeks and months as stewards of your divine plan; to live in gratitude, joy, and an ever growing confidence in your Kingdom to come. We ask for the humility to reform our lives; the courage to commit ourselves to you no matter the cost; and the wisdom to shine the light of faith on others. Open our hearts, give us your Spirit and show us how to share your love so that we may bring hope to a world in need of your justice and peace. We pray to be a sign of your grace in this new year through your son, Jesus Christ, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever.



The Epiphany house blessing of the door is a wonderful Catholic tradition for families. It's very simple to do and is a great way to pray with your family! All you need is a piece of blessed chalk. If you did not receive the blessed chalk during the reverse collection at this weekend's Masses, you may pick up your chalk in the Parish Office. Once you have your chalk, follow these directions and say this prayer.

EPIPHANY HOUSE BLESSING TRADITION

The traditional method for blessing homes is using chalk (an incarnational image because it reminds us of the dust of the earth from which we were made.) The chalk is used to mark the first two numerals of the year - initials of the three kings — last two numerals of the year, for example:

$$20 + C + M + B + 23$$

Over doorways – the numerals consecrate the new year. The initials remind us of the legendary names of the Magi, Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar, and also stand for the Latin moto "Christus mansionem benedicat," or in English "May Christ bless this house."

This rhyme may be used after the door lintel is marked with chalk, or you may use this blessing:

Blessed are you Lord, God of all creation. You bless us with your gift of chalk.

Today with a shining star you guided strangers to your son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

In love the Holy Family welcomed them as guest.

Through the intercessions of your saints
Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar
grant that we who bless our homes with this chalk
may be filled with kindness toward one another
and with hospitality to all those we welcome
in the name of your beloved Son,
who is Lord forever and ever.

Amen.




THE BEAN CAKE

The blessing of the house may be followed with a special meal, traditionally a "King's Cake." In this cake is planted or baked a dried lima bean (or an alternate such as a jelly bean), and the person who finds it becomes king for a day with a royal paper crown. You may choose a favorite bundtcake recipe, and for larger families or groups, you might have three kings.

The bean, or beans, when discovered by the new king may become the main jewel in the waiting paper crown(s). Crowns are then fitted and the new kings crowned with much fanfare.

The king has the honor of ruling the next twenty-four hours, chooses the menu and creates some new house rules effective for twenty-four hours. The king must also prepare a small talk for the family on the lesson they can learn from the story of the three holy kings.

Often the description of their dangerous journey and their encounter with Herod is enough to tout the perils of our own road in life and the need to keep our eyes ever on the star, the light of lights.

STEWARDSHIP IN THE NEW YEAR: MAKING COMMITMENTS TO THE LORD

Stewardship is a commitment of mind and heart to the Lord; a way of life that needs constant renewal and transformation. This time of year has always been one of looking forward to a new year, reflecting on the changes we need to make in our lives and resolving to follow through on those changes. Perhaps those who seek to make resolutions to be better stewards might find inspiration in one or more of the following samples:

Stewardship of Prayer: Resolve to strengthen your relationship with the Lord through prayer. Notice how often you pray and what hinders you from praying. If you are a beginner, commit to short, daily prayer times.

Stewardship of Family: Resolve to set aside more time to stay connected with your family. Eat dinner together, schedule regular dates with your spouse, plan family outings, and go to Mass together. Practice patience and forgiveness.

Stewardship of Health: Resolve to get those medical and dental checkups. Adopt healthier eating habits. Add exercise and other physical activity to your daily routine.

Stewardship of Possessions: Resolve to possess a little more "lightly" this year. Consider ways you can reduce the amount of all that stuff you own. Distinguish between those items that are necessary and those that are considered luxurious and unnecessary.

Stewardship of the Parish Family: Resolve to serve your faith community in some way this year such as at liturgy, in the parish's outreach or education and formation efforts. Is it time to enhance your generosity to the parish?

Stewardship of Money: Resolve to render sacred your annual budget. Reprioritize your financial goals to ensure that the Lord comes first in your spending. Take positive steps to improve your financial health.

"Stewardship is a commitment of mind and heart to the Lord; a way of life that needs constant renewal and transformation." **Stewardship of Work:** Resolve to be faithful to your daily, work-related tasks and offer them up to the Lord. Cultivate your skills. Deepen your knowledge. Be mindful of how you are building the Kingdom of God.

Stewardship of Mind: Resolve to keep your mind active. Commit to being more informed on the issues of the day. Read your bible. In this presidential election year in the United States, become even more familiar with Catholic social teaching.

Stewardship of Neighbor: Resolve to be a person of hospitality and mercy. Make time and space for others who enter your life. Be more aware of those times when a neighbor, co-worker, fellow parishioner or stranger needs a moment of kindness, a little attention or an affirming gesture on your part.




