



THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

The Blessed Virgin teaches us the secret to being blessed, happy, and full of joy. When Elizabeth, her cousin, greets her, she calls Mary "blessed" for two reasons, her motherhood of Jesus and Our Lady's belief that "there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord" (Luke 1:45). Mary is "blessed" entirely because of her relationship to the Incarnation of God in Jesus and for no other. This of course makes perfect sense because as the Lord, as Godin-the-flesh, her son is the source of all blessedness, life, and joy. Mary is blessed because of her contact with Jesus and by her faith in him.

So, it is with us, too. We become blessed by our "motherly" contact with Christ in our souls through baptism. He lives in us and grows to maturity within us. We bear him to the world. This requires unshakeable faith that his promises to us will be fulfilled despite all the problems and difficulties that plague us. We become blessed, happy, and joyful in the measure that we are in contact with Jesus and trust in him.

Advent challenges: 1.) This week, go to someone who has borne the love of Jesus to you and tell her or him how they have been a blessing to you. 2.) Name someone in your life now to whom God has sent you to bring Jesus' presence. Pray: "Lord, thank you for the blessing of sending me to bring your presence to this person. Help me bear you faithfully to him/her."



The Parish Office will close at noon on Tuesday, December 24 and Tuesday, December 31. It will be closed all day December 25 & 26 and Wednesday, January 1.




With the holidays approaching, we will be making adjustments to the hours of the




VISIT US ON SUNDAY!




YOUR 2025 PLEDGE COMMITMENT IS IMPORTANT!

"Advent's Message of Hope: Trusting in God and Choosing Life"

Advent is a season of hope and anticipation, reminding us that God's promises are fulfilled in His time and way. Mary's "yes" to life embodies this hope, as she trusted God's plan despite uncertainty and risk. Her openness to life reminds us that every human being, created in God's image, possesses inherent dignity and divine purpose, beginning at conception.

This truth is beautifully affirmed in the Nativity of Jesus, when the Creator of life entered the world through the womb, taking on human form to dwell among us. Mary embraced God's authority over her life, recognizing that her body ultimately belonged to Him. Mary's "yes" came with great courage, considering the social and personal risks she faced as an unwed mother in her time. Through her courage and faith, Mary brought forth the Savior of the world and teaches us that choosing life is an act of trust in God's providence, knowing that He works through every circumstance for good.

In a culture that often reduces unborn children to "tissue," Catholics proclaim the sanctity of life, rooted in God's authority as the giver and sustainer of all life. Mary's faith and submission remain a powerful model, calling us to defend the dignity of every human life and to trust God's plans, even when they challenge our own. Through her "yes" to life, the greatest gift—Jesus Christ—was given to humanity, bringing forgiveness, hope, and eternal life.

This Advent, may we renew our commitment to honor and defend the sanctity of life, recognizing that in every unborn child, vulnerable person, and human being, Christ's image shines brightly.


