

## SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS



## 1ST SUNDAY OF LENT GOSPEL MEDITATION

When I feel down, I sometimes watch the famous "Double Rainbow" video on YouTube to feel better. It's hilarious. A young man camping in Yosemite Park sees two rainbows stretching across the sky. He bursts into a kind of ecstasy. "Double rainbow, all the way! Oh my God!" he announces. Then he starts to weep. He cries out, "What does it mean?" Beneath the humor of his glorious overreaction is the deep intuition we all have, I think, when we see the colorful bow in the sky. This Sunday, God sends a rainbow to Noah and to us. What does it mean?

Long before YouTube had the double rainbow, Dante's medieval poem *The Divine Comedy* featured one in his image of paradise. Seeing two rainbows, he muses that one is born of the other. The bow is God's promise of peace. For Dante, it's even more: nature's encrypted image of the Trinitarian God. One visible rainbow (God the Son) is begotten of another usually invisible one (God the Father) united by invisible light between them (God the Spirit). Like invisible light, Trinitarian glory surrounds us in every moment — but Jesus has made it visible in his glorious body.

Lenten challenge: This might seem silly, but this Lent I invite you to find a rainbow and meditate on it. You might have to make one yourself, like this current desert-dweller will. Gaze on it. See there a natural gift from the Creator, saying to you, "Here I am! I will love and protect you, surrounding you in My glory." This Lent let's embrace that with confidence, rain, or shine.

## Reflection questions for Sunday, February 25th


• Abraham passed God's test to offer his beloved son Isaac as a sacrifice. Have you ever felt tested by God?



## Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

## CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD (CGS) CORNER

## Prayer

Prayer is, essentially, a conversation with God. It happens in the quiet of the heart or out loud, spoken or sung, written or drawn, private or in a group. Fostering the child's life of prayer is one of the pillars of Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Even the youngest child can have a profound experience with God in prayer. The 3-5 year old is all about enjoying "the gifts" received in what they experience, so their prayer flows from this: spontaneous prayers of praise and thanksgiving. Quietly sitting with a candle, appreciating the gift of light and feeling the joy of the moment can create a connection with God. The 6-8 year old builds on these prayers and begins to see himself in relation to other people. This aged child now offers prayers of petition for those he loves. They are also becoming aware of their mistakes and need for reconciliation and may thank God for saving and loving us despite our many faults.

Prayer at home can take many forms: meal and bedtime prayers, devotions such as the Rosary or Divine Mercy Chaplet, simple spontaneous prayers, songs or drawings. Seeing parents have their own prayer life, as well as having regular prayer times as a family, significantly shapes a child's view of prayer. Having a dedicated space in the home for quiet or family prayer is another way to show that it is an important part of our day. It can be a simple space with a few items which give it an atmosphere of reverence and beauty: a crucifix, piece of sacred art, a candle, holy water, petition book, and/or a statue. To enhance the connection to the Mass, you can place a cloth on this prayer table correlating to the liturgical year: Green for Ordinary Time, Purple for Lent and Advent, White for Christmas and Easter, Red for Pentecost.

May God bless you and your family as you seek more ways to pray together. t




FILL OUT the card attached to the rose.


