THIS WEEKEND'S GOSPEL MEDITATION

Matthew 5:17-37

A few years into my priesthood, I hit a wall. I had taken on too many commitments: Masses, meetings, ministries, projects. I couldn't keep up. I was double-booking, forgetting things, running late, and letting people down. My boss at the time, a wise priest, and our shared secretary noticed. For my birthday, the two gave me a stack of 100 flashcards, each with one word printed in a different language: "NO." It was funny but also painfully true. If I couldn't say no, my yes was in danger.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus says, "Let your 'Yes' mean 'Yes,' and your 'No' mean 'No.' Anything more is from the Evil One" (Matthew 5:37). He's not just giving advice about polite speech. He's showing us something about the freedom of Christian discipleship. The follower of Christ is called to speak clearly, simply, and honestly. There is joy in that kind of freedom.

The Church Fathers often linked this kind of straightforward truthfulness with spiritual maturity. The devil is the father of lies, but Jesus is the Word made flesh. When we hedge, flatter, exaggerate, or avoid, we open space for the shadows to creep in. That little stack of flashcards reminded me that God does not want us enslaved to the expectations of others or to the fear of disappointing them. He wants us to enjoy the peace of saying yes and meaning it and saying no and meaning it, too.

Lenten Challenge: Practice one moment of honest, peaceful speech this week. Maybe it's a sincere "yes" to something important or a humble "no" to something you cannot do. Let it be a quiet step into the freedom Jesus offers.

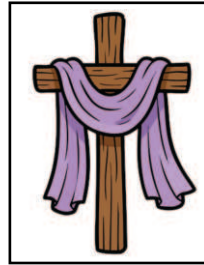
ENCOUNTERING GOD'S SALVATION IN THE DESERT

LEARN ABOUT LENT

The 2026 Lenten season begins with the observance of Ash Wednesday on February 18. The Catholic Church asks each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason: a) Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent. b) Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, in addition to abstaining from meat, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Hence, on those days, they may eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times during those days. The obligation of fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday. Catholics should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

MAKE YOUR LENT MORE MEANINGFUL

The season of Lent offers us forty days to review our lives and focus on conversion and spiritual transformation. It is basically a spiritual "spring training;" a time when we go back to the basics of our faith formation through prayer, fasting, almsgiving and other penitential practices in order to improve and enhance our spiritual lives and prepare ourselves to more fully participate in the paschal mystery of Holy Week with a generous heart and renewed commitment to Christ. Consider some of the following ideas for making your Lenten season even more meaningful this year.

1. Identify some penitential practice you can realistically commit to every day. It's easy to become distracted. A daily commitment will keep you focused. Mark it in your calendar and be faithful to your commitment.
2. Make time in your daily schedule for private prayer, even if it is only ten minutes. Remember, improving our spiritual lives starts with prayer, and the silence of an empty room where we begin to listen to God is invaluable. Prayer requires reserving time for God.
3. Reduce your daily or weekly soft drink or alcohol intake as a spiritual discipline. Drink water and pray for those who lack access to a safe, reliable source of drinking water.
4. It's become a cliché that people are addicted to communication technologies. "Give up" some of your "screen time" each day, whether it's watching television, constantly checking your phone, or surfing the Web. Put the extra time to use: read a passage from Scripture, call or visit a lonely friend or relative, pray the Rosary.
5. Don't shop for clothes during Lent. Stay out of every store except the supermarket and pharmacy, and don't loiter at these places either. Reflect on what it is like for millions in the world who have little or no discretionary income.
6. Make an extra donation to the poor with the money you save. (See #5)
7. Find a way to reduce your daily home energy consumption. With just five percent of the world's population, people living in the U.S. consume 24% of its available energy. Make it a spiritual exercise.
8. Give up negative thinking. Work on a patient, positive attitude toward others. Catch yourself when you mentally berate someone and turn it into a prayer for that person.
9. Take Luke 3:11 seriously. Do you have extra clothes languishing in a closet? Take an afternoon to clean a closet, give a "tunic" or two to a good cause.
10. Pray with the Church. Attend an extra Mass during the week or participate in a devotion that inspires you.

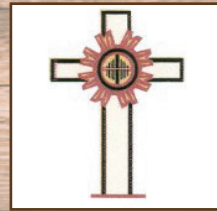

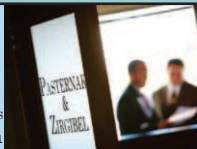
